TUBERCULOSIS CASES MAKE A-LARMING INCREASE IN IDAHO OVER PREVIOUS YEAR

Boise, July 21—(UP)—An alarming increase in number of cases of tuberculosis in the state was reported by the public health department in its report for the fiscal year ending July 1.

The report showed a case increase

of 139 afflicted persons over the 40 cases reported the previous fiscal year. Deaths from tuberculosis, however, showed only a slight increase. Tris year 120 persons were victims, while the year before there were 119 deaths.

Tse state has earmarked \$114,-000 to match a planned federal appropriation of 45 per cent for construction of a tuberculosis hospital, but such will not be possible until federal approval of the project is had.

The report showed that during 1937 there were 10,775 births and 5,319 deaths in the state, both showing an increase over the same period the previous fiscal year. Fulltime public health units in Latah, Nez Perce, Twin Falls and Bannock counties treated 105,149 cases. Cooperative services in Kootenai, Shoshone, Clearwater, Washington, Payette, Madison, and Franklin counties treated 85,102 cases.
