Youths Interested in CCC Enrollment Should Contact Public Assistance Office Immediately

In July, 370 youths were selected and enrolled from the state. The past enrollment was one of the largest and best ever held in this state. This is due not alone to the fact that the CCC provides these young men with wholesome, interesting and constructive outdoor employment, but because the Civilian Conservation Corps is becoming increasingly more popular for the recreational and educational advantages it offers as well.

The county public assistance office states that boys from low income families seeking employment should consider these facts about the CCC: While a young man is enrolled he receives free medical care and clothing. Board and lodging are furnished as a part of the camp life in addition to the cash allowance he receives in camp. Twenty two dollars per month may be sent home to increase a limited family income or, if without de-

pendents and the boy elects, may be placed on deposit to be withdrawn at the time he is honorably discharged. The boys enjoy organized sports, library, and each camp provides a well-equipped recreation hall. Instruction and training in forestry, soil conservation, engineering, mechanics, clerical work, cooking, are a few of the many educational advantages under competent supervision, which prepare the youth for a better paying job after he returns from camp.

The last enrollment this year will be held in October, when another group of boys between the ages of 17 and 23 will be given a chance to enroll. All boys who are interested should make application to the public assistance office immediately. It is important that boys wishing to enroll in October should not delay in contacting their county supervisor, since the number of boys each county is
