Project To Begin As Soon As Funds Are Released

Construction of the Cascade reservoir is practically a cinch, with an appropriation of \$1,100,000 for the project awaiting only the President's signature. The announcement reached the Cascade News today just a few momnts before going to press.

Further, according to the information, this work will be placed under contract at the earliest possible date.

Prior to today, all information available in regard to the appropriation for the Cascade dam was that some time ago the House of Representatives had approved an appropriation of \$700,000. Since then an effort to have the amount increased to more than a million dollars was approved by the senate, following which action a conference of House and Senate committees agreed on the \$1,100,000 appropriation. This item is now included in the Interior appropriation bill which now goes to the President for his signature. As soon as it is signed the funds will be available.

Corroborating this information is a communication to the same effect received by State Representative Harry Bean, director of the Southwstrn Idaho Water Conservation Project, Inc., from H. W. Morrison, president of the

Mr. Morrison stated that there is now a vast amount of work to be done in connection with arranging for repayment contracts, rerouting of the Union Pacific railroad at Cascade, and preparation of plans and specifications and awarding of contracts necessary to get construction underway.
