Forest Fire Burns 600 Acres Near Sulphur Creek

Another 600 acres of Payette forest land was blackened this week when fire raged through the area around Sulphur Creek, keeping more than 300 fire fighters busy for several days.

Breaking out Monday, the fire had a good start before men and supplies could be transported over 18 miles of forest trail to the fire line. About 50 men were flown from Landmark to within a few miles of the blaze, along with a great deal of fire equipment while the rest of the men had an 18 mile hike.

By Friday the fire was under control and fire camps were reported to be breaking up. About 200 civilian fighters from the Boise valley were used to help 125 CCC boys quell the blaze.

Wonst Fire of Season

This has been one of the worst fires in this vicinity, according to the forest service. The fire in Banks a few weeks ago was larger but was not on forest service land. However, the Payette forest helped put it out to keep it from moving onto Payette forest areas.

The cause of the fire has not yet been discovered. It started in an isolated area and could have been caused by lightning or could have been caused by man. Forest officials are still studying the burned area.
