Unemployed Urged To Register With State Employment

An appeal to workers throughout Idaho to register at once with the nearest State Employment office has been issued by A. J. Tillman, acting Director of the Idaho State Employment Service.

He said that by April 15 the Idaho State Employment Service hopes to find out exactly how many workers in the state are available for jobs or training in occupations needed by defense industries and other types of business now expanding. "This registration is being conducted on a Nation-wide scale," he explained, "as part of the national defense program and is designed not only to get the unemployed back to work as quickly as possible, but also to insure that as soon as workers are needed in defense production they can be reached without delay."

He particularly appealed for the immediate registration of: (1) All workers in Idaho who are unemployed and capable of holding jobs, and; (2) All employed persons in the state who have had experience in the following trades: In aircraft manufacturing—airplane sheet metal workers, airplane woodworkers, aeronautical engineers, and inspectors; and shipbuilding—ship carpenters, loftmen, boatbuilders, ship fitters, caulkers, and marine machinists; in machine shops and machinery manufacturing—machinists, tool makers, die makers, lathe operators, and tool designers.
