

# New CCC Camp To be Located On Peninsula

A new CCC Company, with a full quota of 200 men, is planned for location at Crown Point some time in the near future, according to an announcement made by State Forester Franklin Girard, of Boise, Monday.

The Payette Lake peninsula project will be conducted on an area of approximately 1000 acres of state owned land, where redcoats and rangers plotted against the French and where weary frontiersmen smacked mosquitoes during the filming of "Northwest Passage", during the summer seasons of 1938 and 1939. The exact location of the camp buildings and the exact time of establishing the camp, however, were details which are not yet known.

One of the principal purposes for the establishment of this camp will be to clear and clean up a large acreage which, at present, is nothing but boggy land covered by rotting tree snags and fallen timber, so that water lilies and other more attractive vegetation may have a chance to make the scene a more pleasing one for the picnic grounds which are to be prepared in this locality. Present plans also include an easier and more picturesque approach to the beach at the peninsula point by the construction of a new route down the rock cliff at that point.

### Planned For Five Years

Work for approximately five years has been tentatively planned for this location, said Mr. Girard, and the addition of this camp will bring the number of permanent camps composed of Idaho boys to two with headquarters at McCall.
