## Food Stamp Plan Inaugurated in Valley County

Valley County, with four other southwestern Idaho counties, adopted the food stamp plan May 1. Other counties coming under the new set-up are Boise, Owyhee, Elmore and Canyon.

Opening of the plan followed a month of preparatory work in which county commissioners, state and county public assistance departments, various business groups, farmers, wholesale and retailer food trades, WPA, and the U. S. Department of Agriculture all cooperated to have the plan in effect at an early date.

Essentially a program to move surplus crops off over-laden farms, the Food Stamp Plan is expected to result in an additional \$144,000 being spent annually in the area for surplus foods, according to Albert Lee, State Director of Public Assistance.

The current surplus foods list as designated by Secretary of Agriculture Wickard includes: butter, raisins, pork, pork lard, corn meal, eggs, potatoes, fresh oranges, fresh apples, fresh carrots, fresh grapefruit, dried prunes, hominy (corn) grits, dry edible beans, wheat flour, and whole wheat graham flour.

"Direct distribution of surplus foods through commodity depots and trucks is eliminated in those counties in which the plan is now operating. However, distribution of surplus foods will be continued to schools sponsoring free school lunch programs. This latter program finds 355-state schools participating with 300,000 hot lunches being served to thousands of Idaho school children every month," the public assistance director said.

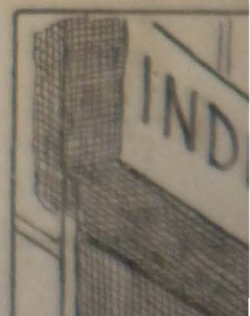
## Valley County More Than \$3

Valley county farmers men are using well over a hundred thousand dollars of Administration loans, according to a joint announcement made recently by the secretary-treasurer of the local credit associations in the county.

L. A. Kalbus, Boise treasurer of the National Farm Credit Associations, which make available Federal Land Bank loans, reported that on December 31, 1940 there were 106 Federal Land Bank bank commissioner loans outstanding in Valley county, for a total of \$306,250.

Blaine Brockman, secretary of the Western Idaho Farm Credit Association, reported that the association made four loans totaling \$293 in Valley county during the end of the year, for which borrowers owed a balance of \$1,000.

Both National Farm Land Bank Credit Associations and Production Credit Associations are affiliated with the Federal Credit Administration. Loans and land bank commissions are made for the purchase and improvement of farms or financing of mortgage indebtedness on farm land. Production Credit Association loans are made for the growing of crops and livestock.

cure food stamps have been mailed to  
all public assistance families by the  
State Department of Public Assist-  
ance. The sale of food stamp books  
will be handled by mail with partici-  
pants remitting money-orders or  
cashier's checks in the correct a-  
mounts to the Boise Stamp Issuing  
Office of the Department of Public  
Assistance, 215 North 6th Street, Post  
Office Box 1128, Boise. According to  
word received today from L. T.  
Vaughn, manager of the stamp issu-  
ing office, \$4,500 worth of orange-  
colored stamps was sold the first two  
days of the month.

"Grocers who have not yet signed  
the official retailer statement forms,  
necessary before stamps can be re-  
deemed by the Treasury Department,  
are requested to write this office and  
the official set of Food Stamps in-  
structions will be sent them, Willard  
Walter, area supervisor, said today.  
He also announced hat the counties  
of Payette, Gem, Washington, Adams,  
Nez Perce, Clearwater, Lewis and  
Idaho would be opened next, with  
preliminary work starting this week.
