## Training Opportunity For Idaho Youths In C C C Camps

The Civilian Conservation Corps  
in Idaho offers many outstanding  
opportunities at this time for Idaho  
boys who are interested in vocational  
training and experience leading to  
employment. Many vacancies exist  
in the Idaho Camps, and applica-  
tions will be taken during the month  
of May from all boys who meet the  
requirements for enrollment.

A wide variety of opportunities  
are available in the Idaho camps for  
ambitious youth. Training is given  
in connection with the regular ac-  
tivities of the camps, and hundreds  
of boys have gone into excellent jobs  
as a result of the work experience  
and training received in the CCC.  
Enrollees in the Idaho camps, most  
of whom having no previous exper-  
ience whatever, are trained to be  
full time specialists in many differ-  
ent skills.

Each camp gives elementary train-  
ing to all enrollees, and from the en-  
tire group are selected those who  
show ambition and a desire to learn.  
These enrollees occupy the "key"  
positions in the camp and receive  
the specialized training and the bene-  
fit of practical experience in skilled  
and semi-skilled jobs. As these en-  
rollees leave, others are selected to  
take their places. At least 40 per  
cent of the enrollees in each camp  
are assigned these "key" positions at  
one time.

Any youth who enrolls with the  
desire to advance to a higher rating  
and a "key" position can do so, pro-  
vided he is able to demonstrate his  
ability and is genuinely interested in  
progressing.
