allotted \$119,000 for the necessary work with the understanding that this sum will be repaid by the consumers over a period of years.

A portable deisel plant, located in

Donnelly, will furnish power until a permanent source of water power can be arranged for, according to the first plans made by the engineers.

Signatures of 75 per cent of the rural residents in the valley were necessary to obtain the allotment. This quota has been passed already and more are signing up every day. The fee for joining the organization, a non-profit cooperative, is five dollars.
