The last stop on the tour was made at McCall, where the feature of the Thursday evening meeting was a mammoth barbecue at Sylvan Beach, with Long Valley beef heading the menu. Imported especially for the occasion was H. Staelin of Pocatelloa barbecuer of no mean ability. Proof of his culinary powers was the rapidity with which the big barbecued beef disapeared.

It was no small job barbecuing the beef, but the excellent results obtained, according to everyone, must have been well worth the effort. It was necessary to construct a special barbecue pit, which in itself took 40 sacks of cement to build. It was erected by C. C. C. boys.

Chef Staelin and his assistant O. B. Beck, cooked the beef for nine hours. 
