

Bids For Dam Are Canceled By Authorities

A general feeling of disappointment was evident in Cascade early this week when it became known that a call for bids for the construction of the big dam at Cascade had been cancelled by authorities in Washington, D. C.

The announcement was made by the reclamation service headquarters in Denver and no explanation for the cancellation was made. The call for bids, which were to have been opened in Boise early next month, was issued in November.

Dispiriting Effect

Although the announcement has had a dispiriting effect on everybody in Valley county, it was not entirely unexpected in some quarters because in spite of the fact that the project was given a favorable OPM rating only a short time ago, there has been a growing tendency on the part of the government to curtail all projects not dealing directly with defense.

It is understood that the Anderson dam, because it is already started and will furnish additional electric energy, will be pushed through to completion.

Work continues, however, on the railroad relocation job here, in connection with the project.
