

# Two Full Strength C C C Camps Maintained Here

This section finds itself in the fortunate position of having two full-strength CCC camps at this time when most of the camps have been closed, and but very few are operating in Idaho.

The two camps in this section are located at Garden Valley and at McCall. Yesterday a detachment of 53 enrollees from Emida, Idaho arrived at McCall.

Before the arrival of these boys from northern Idaho, the camp strength there had dropped to 48 men and for some time there had been considerable doubt that the camp would be maintained.

In addition to the new men who arrived yesterday from the Emida camp, a detachment is being sent to McCall from Garden Valley camp and this reinforcement will bring the total strength of this camp to 125 or more enrollees.

Replacing the men moved from Garden Valley is a detachment of 83 enrollees from the Fort Missoula district in Montana. This is an eastern company and will arrive at Banks at 12:45 p. m., Saturday.

Other replacements for the Garden Valley camp are also on the way, and Payette National Forest officials said today that it is expected the Garden Valley camp will be filled up to its capacity of 160.

The main project of the Garden Valley camp this winter will be on the Middle Fork road, continuing the job that was started two years ago. The job is one of rerouting the road from Crouch to Boiling Springs. The old road largely followed one of the old wagon trails, and it is necessary to get it down to water grade to make a wider road of it.

This is the road which will eventually link Warm Lake with Garden Valley. At the north end of the project there is an eight-mile stretch, across Bull Creek, which is a summer job and has not been started as yet.

# Nutrition for Defense Committee Organizes in Valley County

400,000 men called on the draft have been rejected because of physical defects, chiefly malnutrition, according to State Superintendent of Public Instruction C. E. Roberts, who, Tuesday addressed a representative group of county leaders on the subject of Nutrition for National Defense.

Roberts stated that at the call of the President a National Conference was held which was concerned with problems of Nutrition. As a result of this conference and through the State Advisory Committee, county organizations on nutrition for national defense are being set up in all counties of Idaho. Mrs. Ethel G. Watkins, at this time, was appointed temporary chairman.

The meeting was then opened for informal discussion and various opinions and suggestions were expressed. Mrs. Watkins, reported that many of the common school districts with aid of the Surplus Commodities organization are serving hot lunches for the children. Statistics show, however, that the highest per cent of malnutrition due to use of improper food appears in adults.

It was decided at this time by a unanimous vote to establish a Valley county committee on nutrition for national defense. Mrs. Marion Kerby of Alpha was elected chairman. Mrs. Don S. Numbers of McCall, vice-chairman, and Mrs. Mabel Hasbrouck of Alpha, secretary. An advisory committee of eight members from different parts of the county will meet with the officers, Thursday night, December 4, at the city hall, McCall, to perfect plans of procedure.
