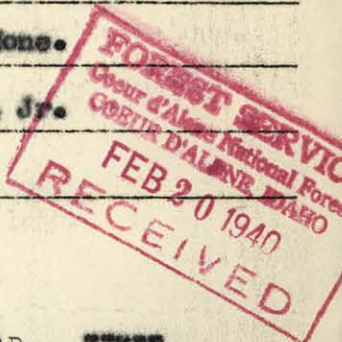

G. REMARKS: (1) Clothing of enrollees was disorderly. No uniformity existed in this respect. Lack of hangers is responsible for a large part of untidiness. Lockers were very untidy. Clothing actually untidy.

(2) The gas line on the generator had a bad leak. This should be repaired as it constitutes a definite fire hazard.

(3) All meats and beef sections should be hung up. Space is sufficient for this.

(4) Exchange should be much neater. Orderly will be instructed to keep it clean and in a storelike manner.

(5) A definite odor existed in the bath house. Suggest a solution of ITH be used in scrubbing down the entire bath house.

1. In order to clear Mr. Hafterson, foreman in charge of Steamboat Spike Camp, this office desires to clearly state that the remarks set forth in the above quoted report are considered entirely uncalled for and unsubstantiated by facts.

2. This office had asked Mr. Hafterson to take up surplus cash so as to safeguard it being left in the canteen which is more or less isolated.

3. It has been the practice for him and Mr. George at Nowhere Spike Camp to give the Canteen Steward a receipt for money taken up; this office receipting to him and crediting the Canteen Steward upon its being turned over to the Camp Store Officer.

4. This office sincerely regrets that the courtesy extended has resulted in embarrassment to Mr. Hafterson and orders have been given to relieve him and others of further trouble in this connection.

G. REMARKS:

(1) Adequate supervision by the Technical Service and Army personnel is not in evidence in this spike camp. Condition of barracks was considered unsatisfactory. Lockers were very disorderly. All shoes were dirty and need of polishing. Clothing in lockers and on enrollees in camp was greasy and dirty. Some shoes were in need of repairs. Clothing was thrown and hanging in the rafters. Foot lockers were disorderly. Poor police of barracks was evident, especially around the stoves. Stoves were badly in need of cleaning and polishing. Enrollees in camp were mixed clothing and some lack knowledge of common rules of courtesy to visiting officers. All concerned will take immediate steps to bring this spike camp up to standard required by the Fort George Wright District. Each camp officer will visit this camp weekly and make a formal inspection, copy of which will be available at the spike camp for inspection.

(2) The Camp Commander will take immediate steps to provide for a system of laundering of clothing, using the facilities of the main camp.

(3) Many shoes and shoe packs in need of shoe laces.


(4) Blankets examined did not have CCC stamped upon them. This condition will be corrected.



- (7) Suggest that at least two more mirrors be provided. ✓
- (8) Garbage disposal unsatisfactory. New pit should be dug for cans and rubbish. Old pits should be carefully covered to prevent breeding of flies. ✓
- (9) Police of camp in general is very poor. The whole area should be raked and policed neatly. ✓
- (10) Grease trap badly in need of cleaning. ✓
- (11) Some of the kitchen utensils were very dirty and unserviceable. Two wire whips and chinacap should be condemned and replaced with equipment which can be kept clean. ✓
- (12) Storeroom appearance could be materially improved. Loft in storeroom untidy and dirty. ✓
- (13) Exchange activities are not being operated as required. Exchange could be kept neater and display could be kept neater. An I. O. U. of a foreman for \$7.50 was found in the cash box. This cash will immediately be replaced and this practice of borrowing money will be considered as absolutely prohibited. No canteen books were found to be available for issue, the first twelve days of the current month. ✓
- (14) Suggest fire orders be made up and posted in all buildings. ✓
- (15) Enrollees observed in camp ~~xxx~~ needed haircuts. Enrollees will be inspected for correction of this condition. ✓
- (16) No library facilities were observed in the camp. The camp E. A. will make necessary provisions to provide a library for the camp. ✓
- (17) ~~xxx~~ An officers register will be provided for in this camp. This register will be signed by all visiting camp administration personnel. ✓
- (18) The number of fire extinguishers is considered inadequate. Only a one quart extinguisher is provided for the kitchen. This should be of a larger type. ✓

MEMORANDUM FOR SUPERVISOR

Reference is made to Inspector Molchan's inspection report covering inspection made April 12, 1940 of the Steamboat Spike Camp.

On April 19, Ranger Hand, Co. Commander Hufford, Supt. Morris, Foreman Rader and I inspected this camp, discussed the items that were unsatisfactory and what could be done to improve the conditions.

There were some exceptions taken to Inspector Molchan's report by both Hand and Morris. Morris had inspected this camp on April 10. Conditions were good at this time. Hand was in this camp on April 12 shortly after the inspection by Molchan and Dyer.

The items will be taken up by the numbers used under remarks on the report.


- (1) These barracks were built in the winter of 1936-37 for the most part out of salvaged lumber from abandoned camps. The lumber was originally of poor quality. Construction started in December. Snow and severe weather added to the difficulties of getting a neat job. The wall lockers were built of scrap lumber. Their appearance is not good. It will be necessary to build new ones. The surplus clothing will be taken to the main camp. A number of the foot lockers are of a type not approved at the present time. These will be removed. The doors salvaged from the Carter Ranger Station will be used to replace the barracks doors that are in the poorest condition.
- (2) Wash tubs, hot water, etc. are always available for laundry purposes. This meets the requirements of the CCC Handbook. However, if the clothing is taken to the main camp for laundering the Forest Service will have to furnish transportation. Maybe this can be worked in with the other camp trips.
- (3) This is being corrected by the Company Commander.

- (4) There is some question about the bedding in the forestry quarters. That belonging to the forest should be paint branded U.S.F.S.
- (5) Doors will be repaired or replaced with better ones.
- (6) These will be varnished.
- (7) These have been received and will be installed immediately.
- (8) New garbage pit has been dug
- (9) Yard has been raked
- (10) This trap is in a poor location from an inspection viewpoint. Suggest that it be moved down the hill.
- (11) Some replacements will be made.
- (12) This has been rearranged. Material in loft has been removed.
- (13) This is a misstatement of the facts. There was no I.O.U. from a foreman in the cash box. There was a receipt from Foreman Hafterson for \$7.50 Both Captain Hufford and Supt. Morris stated that Hafterson's instructions were to take charge of the cash whenever \$5.00 or so had accumulated. This is kept locked up in the forestry quarters and sent to the main camp at the first opportunity.
- (14) Fire orders will be made up and posted in all buildings.
- (15) Closer checkups will be made on this.
- (16) Mr. Dwyer has taken steps to provide a camp library.
- (17) This register will be provided
- (18) Fire extinguishers are in the garage, oil house, kitchen and forestry quarters. More extinguishers will be provided.

Building of new lockers, painting and other improvements involving considerable expense and time will not be done until it is definitely determined that this camp will remain after June 30.
