AWARDS

AMERICAN HISTORY ESSAY CONTEST.—Delta Gamma placed first among campus groups in the twentieth annual contest sponsored by the Sons of the American Revolution, thereby winning possession for the coming year of a bust of Washington designed by Bianchini. A silver medal is awarded to Marjorie Call of Moscow for her essay, "The Music Washington Knew." Second prize, also a silver medal, is awarded to Mary Pennell of Nez Perce for her essay, "The Name is Ethan Allen." A silver medal is awarded as third prize to Lucile Vance of Idaho Falls for her essay, "Benedict Arnold, The Traitor."

THE PHILO SHERMAN BENNETT PRIZE.—Awarded annually for the best essays on a subject dealing with "The Principles of Free Government." For the year 1943-44 the first prize of \$15 is awarded to Ada Mae Rich of Blackfoot for her essay on "The Interest of the United States in the Creation of a World Government Dedicated to the Maintenance of Permanent World Peace," and second prize of \$10 is awarded to Clara Eimers of Emmett for her essay on "An Inquiry Into the Issues of the Soldier Vote."

CIVIL ENGINEERING.—Junior membership in the American Society of Civil Engineers is awarded to Kent Barber of Meridian for his professional paper, "Economics of Locating a Logging Railroad," in the annual contest sponsored by the Spokane Chapter of the society. Mr. Barber is now in the Navy and is stationed at Farragut. Student memberships in the American Society of Testing Materials are awarded to Justin Guernsey of Harrison and Donald Bernhart of Princeton by A. E. Peterson, president of the C. M. Fassett company of Spokane, for outstanding scholarship and active interest in testing engineering materials.

COMMITTEE FOR CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT PRIZE.—A special prize of \$50 was offered by Samuel Pettengill of South Bend, Indiana, for the best essay on private enterprise. This contest was open to all undergraduates of the University of Idaho. A committee of the faculty awarded the prize to Edith Jones of Malad.

WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST TROPHIES.—The 1943-44 William Randolph Hearst National R.O.T.C. Rifle Competition was won by the University of Idaho Rifle Team composed of: Earl T. Crea of Fenn; Herman M. Johnson of Glenns Ferry; Clyde M. Littlefield of Bonners Ferry; Donald E. Grey of Moscow; and Robert D. O'Conner of Wallace. In addition, the individual championship among Senior Units in the Ninth Service Command was awarded to Clyde E. Littlefield.
