AMERICAN SOCIETY OF CIVIL ENGINEERS AWARD—The Spokane Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers awards a junior membership in the organization to the senior graduating in civil engineering who has written the best paper on an engineering project. The winner of this award for 1950 is Francis Joseph Ames of Intake, Montana.

BOYER PLAQUE—Mrs. Katy Rae Boyer has provided a plaque on which is engraved the name of the senior woman graduating in physical education with the highest four-year scholastic average. Valenta Rose Hershberger, Nampa, is the winner of this honor for 1950.

CHRIS HAGAN AWARD—In 1947 Chris A. Hagan of Moscow created a fund from which awards are made to the outstanding seniors in the College of Agriculture and the department of Home Economics. Miss Sheila Claire Darwin of Lewiston will be presented with a silver bowl, and Mr. David Louis Thacker of Paul will receive a wrist watch.

IDAHO DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION—A plaque has been presented by the Idaho Daughters of the American Revolution for an annual Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps award. The name of the graduating midshipman who by his leadership and officer-like qualities has contributed most to the advancement of the University of Idaho and the NROTC program at the University is inscribed on this plaque. This year the honor goes to Lloyd Gaines Martinson of Ardenvoir, Washington.

SIGMA DELTA CHI CERTIFICATE—The national professional journalism fraternity designates a graduating student to receive a certificate of merit for outstanding achievement in the field of journalism. The senior so honored in 1950 is Newton Willard Cutler of Pasco, Washington.

SIGMA DELTA CHI SCHOLARSHIP AWARD—This award, which consists of a certificate of merit, is made to those men or women graduates in journalism who stand in the upper ten percent scholastically in their graduating class. SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so choose, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACHELORS wear the long, pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree — for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.
