

Roger P. Wallins, Ph.D. Associate Dean, College of Graduate Studies **George Carlson**, *nationally recognized artist, sculptor and citizen*. The University of Idaho honors George Carlson, a celebrated Idaho artist and sculptor, for his contributions to the promotion of art in the state of Idaho.

Described as one of America's most sensitive sculptors and finest artists, George Carlson is compassionate, caring and considerate of others. He is held in high regard by universities, corporations, museums and private individuals, who have commissioned his work. He has achieved an artistic eminence that is recognized worldwide.

A realist, George Carlson captures the elusive quality of the soul and spirit in his work. Although many of his pieces are of heroic size, he maintains a sensitive balance between detail and simplicity. He is the recipient of numerous Best of Show awards and in 1996 won the Idaho Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts.

His artwork graces some of the nation's most prestigious public and private collections; few artists command more respect from colleagues. He lends dignity and grace to the subjects of his art; these qualities reflect his own basic character and humanity. His knowledge of the people, ethnography and natural creatures of the West is profound and insightful. His stature as an artist has been acknowledged by significant one-man shows, catalogs and articles that have been distributed internationally.




Few can emulate George Carlson's craftsmanship, scholarship, discipline, attention to detail, inspiration and passion for his work. He is a tireless, consumed, dedicated artist; indeed an inspiration.

He has brought great distinction to Idaho through promotion of our state. In recognition of his tireless dedication to art, the University of Idaho is proud to confer upon George Carlson, a most distinguished citizen, the degree of Doctor of Fine Arts.

J. R. (Bob) Clarkson, former student, industry leader and entrepreneur. The University of Idaho honors J. R. (Bob) Clarkson, a truly exceptional citizen and industry leader, for his contributions to the mining industry in the State of Idaho and the Western United States. A third-generation native of Idaho and former student, he has dedicated his career to improving the mining industry and its affects on the environment.

Bob Clarkson, a gifted engineer and entrepreneur, is one of the mining pioneers of the state. He led in the application of rod mills and fine rock crushing and in the design and application of hydrocyclones in ore classification, for which he received national recognition. Because of the Depression, Bob Clarkson was forced to seek employment rather than to continue his formal education. After a year working in a gold mine in the Boise Basin, he began his career with the Meadow Creek Mine in Stibnite, Idaho. He left Idaho for key positions in California, Nevada and Arizona, but returned to the Bradley Mining Company in 1942.

He conducted a substantial drilling program on the known antimony deposit two miles north of the old Meadow Creek Mine. The goal was to increase United States' antimony reserves that were important to efforts during World War II. During the drilling, the U.S. Geological Survey discovered a major scheelite ore body, and Bob Clarkson played a key role in redesigning and reconstructing the crushing facilities to bring the tungsten into production to replace foreign imports cut off by the war. This innovation was largely a result of Bob's inventive mind.



He developed and patented the Clarkson Feeders and the Clarkson Slurry Valves, which are known to metallurgical plant operators throughout the world. His contributions have revolutionized mineral processing circuits and are commonly used at the phosphate mines in southeastern Idaho today.

A true visionary, at a time when environmental concerns were underestimated, Bob Clarkson designed and installed a new tailings disposal system for the mill at Stibnite. The new dam and pond impounded essentially 100 percent of the pollutants.

Bob Clarkson was a leader in mountain aviation in Idaho. His love of flying revolutionized communication throughout the state's mining industry when telephones were not always reliable and driving between mining districts took several days. In recent years, he has served on the Idaho Flying Hall of Fame Board of Directors.

Bob Clarkson is also noted for his commitment to public education. He served on Valley County's Board of Education during the national reorganization of public education and was the board's leader in integrating the new system of closing rural schools and bussing students to population centers.

In recognition of a lifetime of excellence, vision and exceptional leadership, the University of Idaho is proud to confer upon Bob Clarkson, a most distinguished citizen, the degree of Doctor of Engineering.

Margaret E. Gigray, *alumna*, *civic leader and community advocate*. The University of Idaho posthumously honors Margaret E. Gigray, a truly exceptional citizen and civic leader, for her contributions to the state of Idaho. We are pleased to have her husband, William F. Gigray, Jr., with us today to accept this honor on her behalf.

Four generations of Margaret Gigray's family have attended the University of Idaho, the most recent being her grandson. She dedicated her life to volunteer community services and gave more than four decades of service to the state and nation. She brought great distinction, not only to herself and her family, but also to the University of Idaho

The list of Margaret Gigray's services in the arts, education and community health is very lengthy. She was a founding member of the Friends of Channel 4, Idaho Public Television; chaired the College of Idaho Women's Conference in 1968; and was a member of the Caldwell School Board for four years. She was past chair of the Idaho State Council on Developmental Disability and a member of the Board of Directors of the Pacific Northwest Grantmakers Forum. She thought of her role as chair of the Heart, Cancer, Stroke and Related Illnesses Project as perhaps her greatest accomplishment. This committee brought the first open-heart surgery team to southern Idaho and also organized physicians for team-treatment of heart diseases. And up until her death, she gave much of her time and dedication to educational excellence by serving as a member of the Idaho Community Foundation, the Whittenberger Foundation and the Albertson College of Idaho.



As an example of Margaret Gigray's tenacity and dedication, she wrote an anonymous column in the Caldwell News Tribune, entitled "Airport Report by Loopin' Lou." This was written in the 1950s when Idaho citizens were apprehensive about air travel, especially commercial air travel, which hurt the budding airline service to southern Idaho. In her column she wrote about Caldwell's flight school, the excursions of local pilots, events sponsored by the local chapter of the Civil Air Patrol, the latest improvements in safety and performance and other aviation news. She was a licensed pilot and charter member of the Idaho Ninety-Nines and believed strongly in the importance of air travel. She eventually received her commercial rating.

Margaret Gigray advanced her community, her state and the nation for almost half a century. In recognition of a lifetime of community service, the University of Idaho is proud to confer upon Margaret E. Gigray, a most distinguished citizen, the posthumous degree of Doctor of Humane Letters.

George Henriksen, *local crop producer, agricultural research and extension educator.* The University of Idaho honors George Henriksen for his contributions to agricultural research, education and production in the state of Idaho.

Having lived most of his life in Lewiston, George Henriksen has a reputation as a knowledgeable person with an inquisitive mind who has generated and shared information unselfishly. His efforts have benefited the agricultural industry and economy of north central Idaho.

Widely recognized by crop producers throughout the state as the elder statesman and dean of applied research demonstrations, his pioneering efforts with the University of Idaho College of Agriculture began 30 years ago when he chaired the UI/Nez Perce County Crops and Soils Committee. Under his leadership the committee developed a strong working relationship among producers, agricultural support businesses and College of Agriculture personnel to determine and prioritize local educational needs. This resulted in the delivery of educational programs and implementation and nurturing of grower-driven, on-farm testing in Nez Perce County. Thirty years later, on-farm testing is a recognized and integrated part of agriculture throughout the county and region.

Highly respected by his peers, acquaintances and associates, both on a personal and professional level, George Henriksen is recognized for his willingness to share educational information about new productive farming practices by initiating and cooperating in



demonstrations and applied research methods. He worked with the College of Agriculture to promote various programs such as wheat, oilseed, barley screening, variety trials, fertilizer, herbicide and other research programs on his farm. A screening nursery was set at his farm along with on-farm variety testing trials for the Department of Plant, Soil and Entomological Sciences. Through these screening programs, two soft white winter wheat varieties have been released.

He assisted in the development of a seminar video presentation entitled, "History of Farming in Nez Perce County," for the Nez Perce County extension system, benefiting both crop producers and educators in the area. The video provides a vivid chronology of farming, capturing both successes and problems of the family farm. It has been a valuable and effective educational tool and reference for producers of the area.

George Henriksen is highly respected for his community service as well. He served as president on the Nez Perce County Free Library Board and the Lewiston School Board. He received the Lewiston Chamber of Commerce's Outstanding Farm Citizen Award in 1987.

In recognition of a lifetime of leadership in agricultural research and education, the University of Idaho is proud to confer upon George Henriksen the degree of Doctor of Science.

By noting certain features of a person's apparel, it is possible to learn several things about his or her academic status: the level of the degree attained, the branch of learning in which it was earned, and the institution.

Gowns-

The gowns differ according to the level of the degree. The sleeves are the principal indicator—gowns of doctors have round, bell-shaped sleeves; those of masters have long, closed sleeves that now open at the wrist; and bachelors have long, pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns have distinctive velvet facing around the collar and down the front and three velvet bars on each sleeve.

Hoods-


The size of the hood also varies according to the degree. Although not a part of current academic apparel, hoods of bachelors are three feet long. A master's hood is three and one-half feet long, and a doctor's is four feet in length and has side panels. It is from the colors adorning the hood that one can learn two other facts: the hood is lined with the official colors of the college or university conferring the degree (silver and gold, of course, signifying the University of Idaho) and it is trimmed with velvet of a color denoting the wearer's branch of learning. Following are the colors that correspond to the advanced degrees granted by the University of Idaho:

Doctor of Education, Specialist in Education, and Master of Education light blue

Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (conferred through Washington State University) gray	
Master of Arts and Master of Arts in Teaching white

Master of Fine Arts brown	
Master of Forestry rust	
Master of Music pink

Honor Cords-

Honor Cords, worn around the neck and hanging loosely down the front, identify students who are graduating with honors: bronze cords designate graduation cum laude (with distinction); silver, magna cum laude (with great distinction); and gold, summa cum laude (with highest distinction). The cords are provided by the University of Idaho and are worn on this one occasion only.

The University of Idaho adopted a doctoral gown of its own in 1989. The silver gown has a panel and sleeve bars of black velvet outlined in antique gold. The beret styled soft cap is patterned after the Gold Cambridge version instead of the traditional Silve Oxford-style mortarboard. The cap and gown were designed by Emeritus Professor Edmund Chavez in the university's centennial year and is worn today by faculty serving as officials at the university commencements.

The MACE, a heavy staff or club used in medieval times for breaking armor, acquired a ceremonial function in 13th century France as a symbol of secular authority. The University of Idaho mace, designed by Edmund M. Chavez, professor emeritus, with metal work by Idaho artist Ray Goodner, was used for the first time at the centennial commencement. It is 32 inches long, made of walnut, and encircled with bands of Idaho gold and silver in which Idaho garnets and opals are set. The head is embellished with silver and gold representations of camas plants and syringa flowers.
