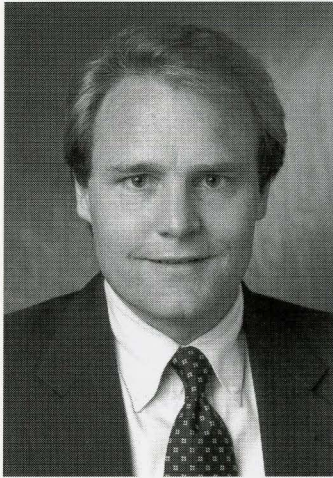

P R E S I D E N T ' S M E D A L L I O N

The President's Medallion, an award initiated by President Bob Hoover in 1998, is to be presented at University of Idaho Commencement Plenary Ceremonies in May and December. Recipients are individuals who have made significant contributions to the cultural, economic, scientific and/or social advancement of Idaho and its people, and have provided exceptional service to the state or nation that has influenced the well-being of humankind. At the December 2000 Commencement, we are honoring five extremely deserving individuals.

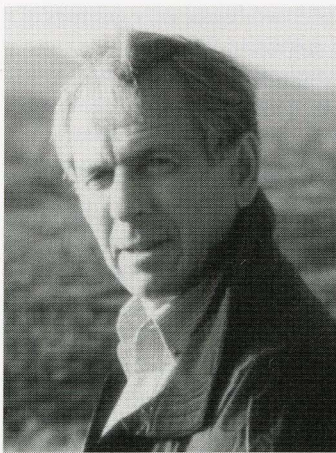


Gregory C. Carr is President of the Gregory C. Carr Foundation, a co-founder of Boston Technology, Inc., and developer of telecommunications hardware and software. He served as CEO of the company until 1992 and was Chairman of the Board from 1992 until Boston Technology merged with Converse Technology in 1998. From 1996 to 1998, Carr was Chairman of Prodigy, Inc., a global Internet service provider.

In 1999, he established the Carr Center for Human Rights Policy at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. The Carr Center is a research, teaching and training center that examines how governmental policies, international organizations, and individuals affect human rights around the world. His interest in human rights started in 1995 when he met Chinese dissident Harry Wu. "There is a very personal moment when you think, 'If I am going to be on this planet, and I am going to enjoy these rights, we have to get to work so everyone can enjoy them,'" Carr stated in a story in the Boston Globe newspaper. He serves on the board of Physicians for Human Rights and is on the Witness Board of Advocates.

Carr issued a "challenge grant" to the people of Idaho to raise money for a human rights memorial. A native of Idaho, he recognized that in addition to a reputation for spectacular vistas, the state also is perceived as a refuge for racists. Citizens responded to his challenge, and construction has begun on the Idaho Anne Frank Human Rights Memorial along the Boise River Greenbelt.

Greg Carr was born in Idaho Falls, and his family remains in the area. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Utah State University, where one of his professors was UI President Bob Hoover. Carr earned a master's degree in public policy from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.



Maurice Hornocker is a wildlife biologist best known for his research on the world's big cats. In his 35-year career, he and his colleagues have conducted pioneering research in North America on cougar, lynx, bobcat, and ocelot; on leopards in Africa and Far-Eastern Asia; jaguars in Central and South America; and tigers in India and Siberia. He also has done groundbreaking research on other carnivores in North America – bears, wolverines, river otters and badgers.

Born in Allerton, Iowa, he received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Montana and his doctorate from the University of British Columbia. Hornocker is the recipient of numerous awards, the most recent include the Earle Chiles Award for Career Accomplishments in Western biology and conservation from the High Desert Museum in Oregon; the Einerson Award for Career Accomplishments in Wildlife Profession, presented by the Wildlife Society; and named one of the "100 Outstanding Living Idahoans."

Dr. Hornocker has published over 100 scientific papers and many popular articles intended to communicate his scientific findings to the public. He has made several documentary films of his work and has published books on several of his research projects.

Throughout his career, he has photographed his research subjects and has utilized photographs as educational tools in the cause of conservation. His photographs of wildlife have been published throughout the world in many different publications and books.

P R E S I D E N T ' S M E D A L L I O N

While at the University of Idaho, Dr. Hornocker mentored 29 graduate students—11 doctoral students and 18 master's degree students. From 1968 to 1985, Dr. Hornocker was leader of the Idaho Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit. He now directs the Hornocker Wildlife Institute, a non-profit research and education foundation he founded in 1985. The Institute moved to Bozeman, Montana, in July 2000, and is dedicated to creating and disseminating new knowledge through basic ecological research. The Institute conducts long-term research with special emphasis on threatened and endangered species in wilderness environments and their importance to man.

The University of Idaho has been provided an unusual opportunity to honor three Idaho citizens for their heroism, dedication and leadership during the forest fires last summer which besieged much of Idaho, including the Taylor Ranch Wilderness Field Station.

Holly A. Akenson and James J. Akenson are co-managers of the Taylor Ranch Wilderness Field Station and have been research biologists for the University of Idaho since 1997. They also served in the same capacity from 1982-1990.

Holly and Jim are responsible for coordinating and facilitating research, educational, and maintenance activities. As supervisors of the summer internship program, they teach field research techniques, backcountry horsemanship and wilderness skills to undergraduate students.

In addition to their other responsibilities, Holly conducts research on cougar and wolf predation in the wilderness in cooperation with the Hornocker Wildlife Institute. Jim conducts research on cougar and wolf interaction and predation behavior on deer, elk, and bighorn sheep. The Taylor Ranch works closely with state and federal natural resources agencies, secondary schools, and private organizations to develop cooperative research and educational projects.

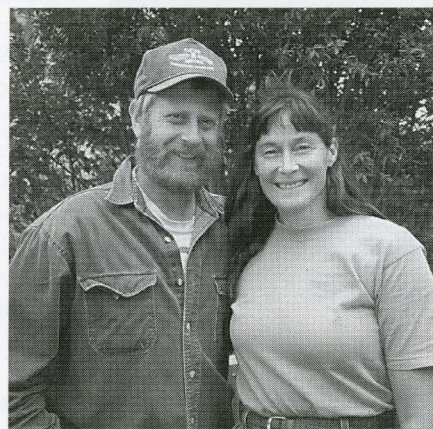
Prior to returning to the Taylor Ranch, they both worked with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and Idaho Department of Fish and Game.

Holly holds a master's degree in Wildlife Resources from the University of Idaho, and two bachelor's degrees from Eastern Oregon University, in education and in biology. Jim holds a master's degree in Resource Geography from Oregon State University, and a bachelor's degree in Environmental Studies from Eastern Oregon University.

Ray Arnold is owner of Arnold Aviation in Cascade, and a backcountry pilot. He is being honored today for his courage in helping to rescue University of Idaho personnel at the Taylor Ranch Wilderness Field Station during the forest fires this past summer. Landing a plane at Taylor Ranch has been compared to landing a plane in the Rose Bowl--there's very little room for error. Without concern for his own safety Arnold repeatedly flew into the ranch as fires closed in to rescue University of Idaho researchers and student interns.

As noted in The Wall Street Journal, this aviator has performed similar run-of-the-mill heroics since 1975, delivering the U.S. mail to "homemade runways located between mountains, alongside cliffs and amid pine trees and livestock." Arnold services the longest postal route in the continental United States--over 400 miles, as the crow flies, on his twice-weekly mail deliveries to 22 rural homes.

A former teacher, Arnold now rescues stranded hikers, injured snowmobilers and exhausted sportsmen. His family-run company provides wilderness drop-off and pick-ups for hunters, hikers, fisherman and anyone wanting to enjoy Idaho's remote, roadless wilderness areas.

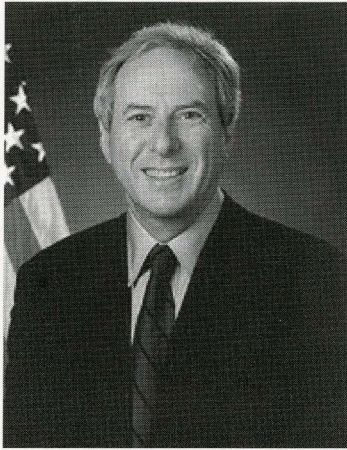

Daniel S. Goldin, *government official, defense-industry leader, and space exploration pioneer.* The University of Idaho honors Daniel S. Goldin, administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, for his contributions to space research and exploration and the betterment of humankind.

Since assuming his position in 1992, NASA's longest-serving administrator has revolutionized America's aeronautics and space program. Despite lower budgets his "faster, better, cheaper" approach has enabled the agency to deliver programs of high value to the American public without sacrificing safety.

In presenting Mr. Goldin with a 1998 Laurel Award for outstanding achievement in aviation and aerospace, *Aviation Week & Space Technology* magazine said he has "delivered on his promise to reshape NASA into a model government agency." When named one of the 100 most influential men and women in government, the *National Journal* observed that "most space watchers say that Goldin is a brilliant visionary who brought NASA back from the brink of a black hole."

Nowhere has Goldin's vision been more evident than in his comprehensive strategy for space exploration. He initiated the Origins Program to understand how the universe has evolved, to learn how life began on Earth and to see if life exists elsewhere. He led a rescue plan for the successful installation of a "contact lens" on the Hubble Space Telescope. He also has laid the foundation to complete the first scientific census of the solar system and to send the first probe into interstellar space.

To expand opportunities for public and educational participation in the adventure of space exploration and research, Goldin directed NASA's program managers to incorporate Internet access into mission outreach plans. In 1998, *Yahoo Internet Life* magazine selected the NASA site as one of the 12 best on the World Wide Web, and for two consecutive years has named it the "Best Astronomy Internet Site."

Goldin played a pivotal role in redesigning the International Space Station. Starting with the Space Shuttle program, he has established a goal to transfer day-to-day space operations to the private sector. This will enable the agency to dedicate its resources to long-term, high-risk research and development and help establish a permanent human presence beyond low Earth orbit. To ensure a robust future for the aerospace industry and to build new commercial opportunities in space tourism, he has challenged NASA's Aero-Space Technology Program to make space travel 10,000 times safer and 100 times cheaper.

Before coming to NASA, Mr. Goldin was vice president and general manager of the TRW Space and Technology Group in Redondo Beach, Calif. During a 25-year career at TRW, Mr. Goldin led projects for America's defense and conceptualized and managed production of advanced communication spacecraft, space technologies and scientific instruments. He began his career at NASA's Lewis Research Center in Cleveland, Ohio.

He is a member of the National Academy of Engineers and a fellow of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics.

In recognition of his contributions to space research and exploration, the University of Idaho is proud to confer on Daniel S. Goldin, a most distinguished citizen, the degree of Doctor of Engineering.

By noting certain features of a person's apparel, it is possible to learn several things about his or her academic status: the level of the degree attained, the branch of learning in which it was earned, and the institution.

Gowns—

The gowns differ according to the level of the degree. The sleeves are the principal indicator—gowns of doctors have round, bell-shaped sleeves; those of masters have long, closed sleeves that now open at the wrist; and bachelors have long, pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns have distinctive velvet facing around the collar and down the front and three velvet bars on each sleeve.

Hoods—

The size of the hood also varies according to the degree. Although not a part of current academic apparel, hoods of bachelors are three feet long. A master's hood is three and one-half feet long, and a doctor's is four feet in length and has side panels. It is from the colors adorning the hood that one can learn two other facts: the hood is lined with the official colors of the college or university conferring the degree (silver and gold, signifying the University of Idaho) and it is trimmed with velvet of a color denoting the wearer's branch of learning. Following are the colors that correspond to the advanced degrees granted by the University of Idaho:

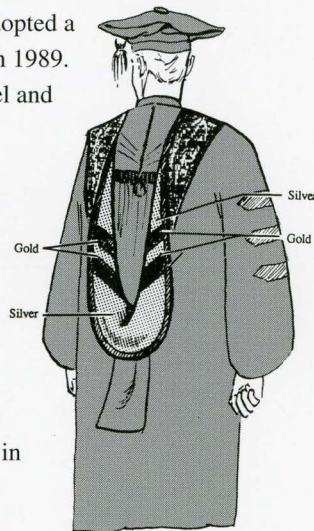

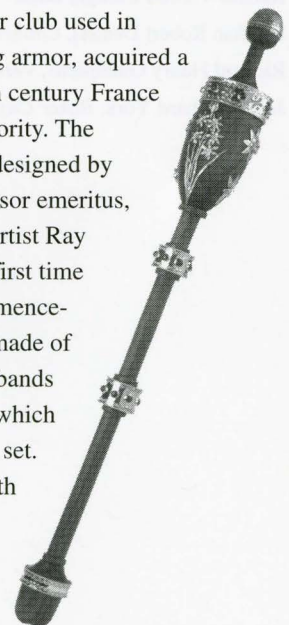
Honor Cords—

Honor Cords, worn around the neck and hanging loosely down the front, identify students who are graduating with honors: bronze cords designate graduation cum laude (with distinction); silver, magna cum laude (with great distinction); and gold, summa cum laude (with highest distinction). The cords are provided by the University of Idaho and are worn on this one occasion only.

The University of Idaho adopted a doctoral gown of its own in 1989. The silver gown has a panel and sleeve bars of black velvet outlined in antique gold. The beret styled soft cap is patterned after the Cambridge version instead of the traditional Oxford-style mortar-board. The cap and gown were designed by Emeritus Professor Edmund Chavez in the university's centennial year and is worn today by faculty serving as officials at the university commencements.



The MACE, a heavy staff or club used in medieval times for breaking armor, acquired a ceremonial function in 13th century France as a symbol of secular authority. The University of Idaho mace, designed by Edmund M. Chavez, professor emeritus, with metal work by Idaho artist Ray Goodner, was used for the first time at the 1989 centennial commencement. It is 32 inches long, made of walnut, and encircled with bands of Idaho gold and silver in which Idaho garnets and opals are set. The head is embellished with silver and gold representations of camas plants and syringa flowers.
