

President M. Duane Nellis

M. Duane Nellis began serving as the University of Idaho's 17th president on July 1, 2009. During his first two years in office, he has led the University to record student enrollments, bolstered the University's research mission, and extended University programs that help the people of the state educationally and economically. Also, President Nellis has brought the University community together to develop a new Strategic Action Plan for 2011-15.

As the University's chief executive officer, President Nellis provides robust and engaging leadership for the University of Idaho. He provides support to 42 statewide extension offices and University

center locations in Boise, Coeur d'Alene and Idaho Falls. He works with the WWAMI (Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana and Idaho) Medical Education program to ensure that Idaho is supported, along with the 20 first-year medical students on the Moscow campus each year. Nellis also is engaged with the University alumni, friends, donors, faculty, staff and students around the world to create a University that is more entrepreneurial, sustainable, international, interdisciplinary and diverse.

Previously, President Nellis served as provost and senior vice president at Kansas State University where he oversaw 12 deans and 10 other units, including the offices of the vice provost for information technology services and the vice president for research. He also served for seven years at West Virginia University as dean of the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences, WVU's largest academic college.

President Nellis was appointed by Gov. C L. "Butch" Otter as a commissioner of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education. He has held other professional leadership positions as well, including the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities Academic Officers Executive Council; president of the Association of American



Geographers; National Council for Geographic Education; Gamma Theta Upsilon, the international geographic honor society: Kansas Academy of Sciences: and member of the National Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences Research Universities Committee. President Nellis is recognized nationally and internationally for his research that utilizes satellite data and geographic information systems to analyze various dimensions of the earth's land surface. This research has been funded by more than 50 sources such as NASA. the National Geographic Society, the U.S. Agency for International Development, and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. His

research has led to more than 100 articles and reports in a wide range of professional journals, and 15 books and book chapters. He has given more than 100 professional presentations and has been invited to speak at more than 60 universities and related settings internationally.

He also has been recognized nationally and internationally for his research and teaching through numerous awards from organizations such as the Association of American Geographers (AAG), AAG's John Fraser Hart Award for Excellence in Research, the Outstanding Contributions Award by the AAG's Remote Sensing Specialty Group, the Young Research Scholar Award by the Institute of British Geographers, the Kansas State University Outstanding Teaching Award and University Adviser of the Year Award.

President Nellis is a native of the Northwest: he was born in Spokane, Washington. He met and married his wife, Ruthie, while pursuing his bachelor's degree in earth sciences/geography at Montana State University. He received his master's and doctoral degrees in geography at Oregon State University.



Bruce Pitman, Ph.D.

Dr. Bruce Pitman is the vice provost for Student Affairs and Dean of Students. He earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education from Purdue University in 1971. Pitman also holds a master's degree in counseling and a Ph.D. in higher education administration, '75, '89, both from the University of Idaho.

Pitman came to the University of Idaho in 1973 to begin work in student affairs, serving as an assistant Greek advisor. He became Dean of Students in 1981. He has been part of many changes in campus life including the planning of the Idaho Commons, the Student Recreation Center, the Living Learning Centers and the U-Idaho Diversity Center. He has been involved with the creation of university-level learning outcomes, student retention initiatives, campus safety issues, supporting students who are at-risk and volunteer service initiatives. He has recently traveled to Bay Saint Louis, Mississippi, Cameron, Louisiana and Washington, D.C. as a staff advisor to student teams conducting hurricane restoration and addressing urban poverty issues.

He has been active in several professional associations. He is a member of the National Association of Student Affairs Administrators where he has served on conference committees and advisory boards. He was awarded the Scott Goodnight Award for Outstanding Performance as a Dean for the Pacific Northwest in 2000 by the National Association of Student Affairs Administrators. He also served as president of the Northwest College Personnel Association. He has also been honored with an Outstanding Employee Award by the University of Idaho and has a tree planted in his honor on the U-Idaho administration lawn by the Student Alumni Relations Board.

He and his wife Kathy and their three children, Andrew, Evan and Bridget, have all earned degrees from the University of Idaho. Pitman currently serves on the national board of directors of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity and as an elder at the Moscow First Presbyterian Church. He is actively involved with the Moscow Poverty Task Force, seeking solutions to homelessness on the Palouse.

Janet DeVlieg-Pope

Janet DeVlieg-Pope has a heart for the outdoors and a mind for helping others appreciate it. She has had the opportunity to experience first-hand the joys of the natural world and the rewards of giving to others by her association with her family non-profit foundation. In 1961, with profits from his Michigan-based precision machine tool manufacturing company, Janet's grandfather, Charles B. DeVlieg, established the DeVlieg Foundation, a private, tax-exempt charity interested in giving young engineers educational opportunities. Janet's father and mother continued this foundation's legacy of giving until their deaths in the late 1990's.

Janet worked for 15 years as advertising manager/graphic artist for her grandfather's DeVlieg Machine Company before coming to Idaho. Today, Janet is president of the DeVlieg Foundation and is continuing her family's philanthropic heritage. She has combined her interest in sharing engineering and the outdoors to motivate students to study and develop the necessary knowledge and resources to ensure we will always have wilderness areas.

Janet also multiplies her appreciation for the natural world by dedicating Foundation funds to support academic research and hands-on field experiences in the areas of natural resource conservation and wildlife management. She understands science is needed to solve environmental problems facing the world, thus the Foundation encourages projects that apply engineering solutions to natural resource sustainability. It is an interdisciplinary collaboration between social scientists, natural resource experts, physical scientists and engineers.

Moving from Michigan in 1987 to Idaho after purchasing a remote 1,300-acre ranch on the lower Salmon River in Idaho County, Janet was able to appreciate and love the wildness of Idaho. She met Jim Pope, a helicopter pilot contractor who

flew wildlife surveys for several states wildlife agencies, and they spent the majority of their time in the backcountry of Idaho. Jim had a long historical association with Taylor Ranch and introduced Janet to the opportunities to be involved with wilderness research.

She now is a long-time supporter of the Taylor Wilderness Research Station, a University of Idaho wilderness laboratory nestled deep in the backcountry of the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness. Her steadfast and unwavering commitment to Taylor provides transformational educational opportunities for U-Idaho engineering and natural resources students and faculty, as well as visiting scientists from other institutions.

Among the DeVlieg Foundation's notable contributions to the University was the 2004 construction of an 11-person cabin at Taylor, which bears the Foundation's name. She and Jim volunteered hundreds of "labor of love" hours to complete the DeVlieg Cabin, which provides a beautiful living-learning structure for interns, faculty and researchers.

The Foundation is involved with undergraduate internships and graduate research assistantships for the College of Natural Resources' students at Taylor. Currently, renewable energy utility systems are being developed at Taylor, designed and constructed by young engineers in senior capstone studies in the university's College of Engineering. A new hydro and solar power grid have recently been installed, and work is being done to improve water availability.


Additionally, the DeVlieg Foundation supports the McCall Outdoor Science School and College of Natural Resources graduate education, with scholarships and funding for MOSS graduates to experience Taylor's wilderness. At the same time, the Foundation also supports an undergraduate mechanical engineering scholarship for the College of Engineering and a graduate program with the U-Idaho Center for Ecohydraulics in Boise.

The Popes enjoy getting to know and mentor the students whose research projects are supported by the Foundation. They join students to conduct field research, follow their scientific discoveries and support student and faculty flight expenses into the roadless Taylor facility.

In recognition of her public service and contributions to resource management and engineering in Idaho and beyond, the University of Idaho is proud to confer upon Janet DeVlieg-Pope the honorary degree of Doctor of Natural Resources.

University of Idaho President's Medallion

The President's Medallion is presented to individuals who have made significant contributions to the cultural, economic, scientific and/or social advancement of Idaho and its people, and have provided exceptional service to the state or nation that has influenced the wellbeing of humankind.



J. Michael Mahoney

When J. Michael Mahoney established the M. Duane Nellis, Sue Eschen and Shawna Lindquist Scholarship Endowment at the University of Idaho in July, it was the 11th scholarship endowment the Larkspur, California, resident endowed in honor of others, many of whom he has never met. Many of Mahoney's gifts are named in honor of Idaho residents whose lives were cut short. For instance, his first gift to the University was in honor of Stephanie Lynn Crane, a 9-year-old Challis girl who went missing on October 11, 1993; she has never been found.

"The reason I like to establish scholarships is because it really is a gift that keeps on giving," Mahoney explains. "These scholarships provide a living memorial to people who died too young, while providing help for countless others."

Since 1995, Mahoney's endowments have awarded more than \$1 million in scholarship funds to 176 U-Idaho students. His most recent endowment honors retired University of Idaho Foundation, Inc. employee Sue Eschen who assisted Mahoney in creating his endowments, former financial aid employee Shawna Lindquist (who succeeded Eschen at the Foundation), and current University President M. Duane Nellis.

"Mike is such an extraordinary individual and honors us through his wonderful generosity," says President Nellis. The 82-year-old philanthropist has established nearly 50 scholarships at universities nationwide. He is an honorary alumnus of Idaho as well as a 2011 President's Medallion recipient.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC APPAREL AND MACE

By observing certain features of the academic apparel, it is possible to learn several things about the academic status of the scholar: the level of the degree attained, the branch of learning in which it was earned, and the college or university conferring the degree.

Gowns

The gowns differ according to the level of the degree. The sleeves are the principal indicator – gowns of bachelors have pointed sleeves; those of masters have oblong sleeves with an arc cut away at the front; and doctors have round, bell-shaped sleeves. Bachelor's and master's gowns are untrimmed. Doctoral gowns have distinctive velvet facing down the front and three velvet bars on each sleeve.

Caps

The color of the tassel worn on the cap varies with the level of degree. The bachelor's tassel represents the color appropriate to the major field of study; the master's and specialist's tassels are black; and the doctoral tassels are old gold.

Hoods

The length of the hood also varies according to the level of degree. The bachelor's gown is worn without a hood. A master's hood is three and one-half feet long, and a doctor's hood is four feet in length and has panels at the sides. It is from the colors adorning the hood that one can learn two other facts. Lining – the hood is lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree (silver and gold, signifying the University of Idaho). Trimming – the hood is trimmed with velvet of a color appropriate to the wearer's branch of learning. For example, the trimming for the degree of Master of Science in Agriculture is maize, representing agriculture, rather than golden yellow, representing science. (In the case of the Doctor of Philosophy degree, the dark blue color is used, representing the mastery of the discipline of learning and scholarship, regardless of the branch of learning.) Colors associated with the different disciplines are as follows:

Honor Cords

Honor Cords, worn around the neck and hanging loosely down the front, identify students who are graduating with honors: gold, summa cum laude (with highest distinction); silver, magna cum laude (with great distinction); and bronze cords designate graduation cum laude (with distinction). The cords are provided by the University of Idaho and are worn on this one occasion only.

The University of Idaho adopted a doctoral gown of its own in 1989. The silver gown has a panel and sleeve bars of black velvet outlined in antique gold. The beret-styled soft cap is patterned after the Cambridge version instead of the traditional Oxfordstyle mortarboard. The cap and gown were designed by Emeritus Professor Edmund Chavez in the University's centennial year and is worn today by faculty serving as officials at the University commencements.

The mace, a heavy staff or club used in medieval times for breaking armor, acquired a ceremonial function in 13th century France as a symbol of secular authority. The University of Idaho mace, designed by Edmund M. Chavez, professor emeritus. with metal work by Idaho artist Ray Goodner, was used for the first time at the 1989 centennial commencement. It is 32 inches long, made of walnut, and encircled with bands of Idaho gold and silver in which Idaho garnets and opals are set. The head is embellished with silver and gold representations of camas plants and syringa flowers.
