SUPERIOR SENIOR CADET RIBBON AWARD—The Department of the Army presents annually a ribbon and certificate to the outstanding Senior cadet based on military and academic leadership, military and academic scholarship, and demonstrated qualities of discipline, courtesy and character. The winner of this award for 1958 was Cadet Colonel Larry P. McDonald, Moscow.

W. A. TARR AWARD—Sigma Gamma Epsilon, national professional earth science society, presents a certificate known as the W. A. Tarr Award to the student graduating in one of the earth sciences who is outstanding in scholarship, leadership and personality. The winner of this award for 1958 was Eugene A. Lees, Coeur d'Alene.

Docrons wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the erm: the master's hood is of more moderate size. Bachencons wear the long pointed sleeve: the hood is small. UNDERGRAD-UATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree – for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet, pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.
