Citation of Merit Upon Retirement

George O. Baker, Professor of Agricultural Biochemistry and Soils, Emeritus

George Orien Baker has served the University and the State of Idaho for 30 years. His research endeavors in Soils resulted in increased crop yields and the stimulus to the use of sound soil management practices. A dedicated teacher, Professor Baker gave willingly of his time to the instruction and counseling of students.

Clarence D. Bechtolt, Extension Agricultural Agent

Clarence D. Bechtolt, Caldwell, Agricultural agent and chairman of the Canyon County staff, retired in January 1966. He began Idaho extension work in 1944 in the Black Canyon area of Canyon and Payette counties. He served as Canyon county agent since 1949. His dedicated service to the people of this intensive agricultural area has helped develop one of Idaho's most important agricultural counties.

Ray M. Berry, Professor of Education, Emeritus

Dr. Ray M. Berry came to the University of Idaho in 1946 after an illustrious career as teacher, and administrator in Oregon, Washington and Idaho public schools. As Professor of Education and Head of the Department of Education for ten years, he served the University and State in the best tradition. He retires after 48 years of service to education, 20 with the University of Idaho.

Charles H. Bond, Counselor

Charles H. Bond spent 21 years as a public school teacher and administrator before establishing a Veterans Administration Guidance Center on the University campus in 1944. He has served as administrator of this center and, since 1949, as Director of Testing and Counseling Services for the University. During his career his chief purpose has been to provide service, encouragement, and sound advice to young people.

William H. Boyer, Professor of Psychology, Emeritus

The career of Dr. Boyer in the service of the University and the State of Idaho spans 38 years. His long and illustrious career as professor and Head of the Department of Psychology has enriched the background of many students. His contribution to the etablishment of the professional status of psychology in Idaho are milestones long to be remembered.

George E. Cook, Extension Agricultural Agent

George Cook, agricultural agent in Idaho county since 1950, retired in March 1966. A graduate of the University of Idaho, he was agent for Lincoln county from 1946 to 1950 with offices in Shoshone. He has since served in Idaho county where he was highly influential in wheat and cattle production programs and in advancement of youth work.

Warner H. Cornish, Director of Family Housing

Warner H. Cornish, Director of Family Housing since 1946, retired April 30, 1966, following Regents' approval. His arrival on campus coincided with the heavy influx of World War II veterans. Housing was of prime importance. He demonstrated his ability and untiring determination to find adequate housing for all married students seeking education.

Eugene Giles, Professor of Psychology, Emeritus

Dr. Giles joined the University in 1948 following 18 successful years with the public schools in Washington. While at the University of Idaho he has been highly influential in gaining professional status for guidance and counseling services and in developing counselors certification in Idaho. The success of Dr. Giles as a teacher is attested to by the demands for his graduate students by public schools and colleges.

E. Malcolm Hause, Professor of History and Political Science, Emeritus

After many years of previous service as a teacher and administrator, Dr. E. Malcolm Hause joined the University faculty in 1948. He holds a bachelor's degree from Union College, a master's degree from University of Nebraska, and a Ph.D. from Northwestern University. He has done extensive research in English history, specializing in the Protectorate and the Stuart kings, and has made fine contributions in the classroom and in community service.

Thomas B. Keith, Professor of Animal Science, Emeritus

Thomas Bryon Keith returned to his alma mater in 1947 to teach and conduct research in animal science. His research contributions are many; his service to his country in two world wars and his outstanding service to people of Idaho and students of this institution are worthy of highest commendation.

Chester R. Kerr, Manager, Bookstore

Chester R. Kerr, a popular alumnus, joined the University in 1942 to manage the "Blue Bucket Inn" and the emerging student bookstore. On the completion in 1949 of the enlarged Student Union, he relinquished the food service duties to give full attention to the growing demands of the bookstore. Ever sensitive to the needs of both students and faculty, Mr. Kerr has developed a modern bookstore established to meet, with efficiency, the requirements of our growing University.

Karl H. W. Klages, Professor of Agronomy, Emeritus

Karl H. W. Klages, Agronomist, and an authority on crop ecology, is revered by students and faculty as an inspiring teacher, counselor and leader in research. Farm productivity in Idaho has increased steadily for 30 years because of his work on improvement of crop varieties and crop seed stocks.

Clifford E. Lampman, Professor of Poultry Science, Emeritus

C. E. Lampman, Professor and Head, Emeritus, has contributed 38 years of service to the University, its students and to the Idaho poultry industry. His early work contributed to our knowledge of leukosis disease, vitamin A and proteins. His major contribution has been as a leader in development of modern environmental controlled poultry housing.

G. T. McAlexander, District Extension Agent Supervisor

G. T. McAlexander, District Extension Supervisor, retired in October 1965 after 35 years as county agent and district agent. He served in Benewah and Latah counties before becoming District Supervisor in 1944. He was responsible for helping plan long-range extension programs in northern Idaho which have materially assisted development of the area.

Chester A. Moore, Professor of Civil Engineering, Emeritus

Chester A. Moore came to the University in 1949 as Professor and Head of Civil Engineering. A native of Boston and a graduate of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Professor Moore performed engineering work for the federal government and many private companies from 1922 to 1949. He is a registered engineer and a member of many state and national engineering societies.

Allan Perry, Instructor of Communications

His unselfish devotion to his duties in the Audio-Visual Center, his twenty-two years of exemplary service to the teaching-learning process, the regional and national recognition of his competence in the areas of the New Media of Communications, and his dedication to the educational well-being of his home state and alma mater are just a few of the many attributes which we recognize on this day of the official retirement of Allan Perry.

Emmet E. Spiker, Assistant Professor of Physics

Professor Emmet E. Spiker joined the staff of the University in 1946 after serving for many years in Idaho's public schools. He completed his undergraduate work at the University of Idaho and his graduate work at the University of Washington. He will be long remembered for effective work as a teacher and for furtherance of research through skillful operation of the electron microscope.

William Wesley Staley, Professor of Mining, Emeritus

William Wesley Staley, Professor of Mining Engineering, has been on the University staff since 1929. He has written 2 textbooks and several technical papers on mining engineering. On two leaves of absence he assisted in reorganizing the wartorn Universities of the Philippines and of Seoul, Korea. His two children, William Wesley, Jr., and Susan are both Idaho graduates.

Edward S. Stimson, Dean and Professor Emeritus, College of Law

Dean Edward Schaad Stimson joined the University faculty in 1947 as Dean and Professor of Law. An able administrator, noted author and respected teacher, he is best known to students and the Bar of our state and nation for his work in the difficult area of Conflicts of Laws. His wise counseling will be sorely missed.

Ruben C. Thielke, Professor of Chemistry, Emeritus

Dr. Ruben C. Thielke joined the staff of the University in February, 1946. He took his bachelor's and master's degrees from Oregon State College and his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. He has twice been selected by the students as an outstanding teacher. He has written numerous scientific articles, and will long be remembered by his students and colleagues as a true scholar, a great teacher, and a fine character.

Guy P. Wicks, Associate Dean of Students, Emeritus

Guy P. Wicks has been concerned with the education of Idaho youth for 34 years as a high school teacher, as Athletic Director and coach at Idaho State University, and as a University of Idaho coach of varsity basketball and baseball. Since 1955, he has been Associate Dean of Students and advisor to Idaho fraternities, and has made many contributions to the growth and strength of the University fraternity system.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACH-ELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinc-tive of the degree—for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedaengineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue, commerce and accounting, drab.
