Citations of Merit Upon Retirement

Mabel Rentfro Beattie, Professor of Foreign Languages, Emerita

Professor Beattie graduated from the university and joined the faculty in 1926. She has preserved the Latin major, and since 1951 she has edited the Idaho Foreign Language Teachers "Forum." She has put her stamp on many science and pre-medical students with her course in Greek and Latin terminology.

Herbert A. Berman, Professor of Law, Emeritus

Professor Berman, first employed as an associate professor in 1952, became a professor of law in 1957. He is respected for his scholarly approach, and his intolerance of slovenly thinking. His courses in government regulation of business have been a high light for his many students.

Roland C. Bevan, Associate Professor of Agricultural Economics, Emeritus

Roland C. Bevan, Associate Professor of Agricultural Economics, Emeritus, retired May 31, 1967. He joined the agricultural economics staff at Idaho in 1946. Hundreds of students will remember him for his courses in farm management and in farm accounting and appraisal, and as a friendly and sincere advisor to them as individuals. He made many significant contributions to Idaho people through his research on costs and management of many different kinds of farm enterprises.

Alfred W. Bowers, Professor of Anthropology and Sociology, Emeritus

Professor Bowers came to the University of Idaho in 1949. His studies of the Mandan and Hidatsa Indians have gained him international renown. He has also carried out two extensive field studies on the early Indians in Idaho. Both the state and the university are richer for the knowledge he has produced and for the extensive collection of Indian artifacts now available for use by future generations of scholars.

Mary Cannon, Extension Home Economics Agent

Mrs. Mary Cannon, extension home economics agent in Bingham county, will retire on August 31, 1967. A graduate of Brigham Young University, Mrs. Cannon had a distinguished career as an elementary and home economics teacher in a number of Idaho schools. She joined the Idaho Extension staff in Bingham county in 1959, where she has served until her retirement. She has given outstanding service in Home Economics and youth work to the people of Bingham county.

Jean Collette, Professor of Dramatics, Emerita

Professor Collette graduated from the University of Idaho and returned to teach in 1931. Under her chairmanship of dramatics, the university and the community have enjoyed an outstanding fare of plays. The Summer Theatre, introduced in 1953, has provided an especially rich legacy with five plays each summer.

Kenneth A. Dick, Professor of Accounting, Vice President for Financial Affairs and Bursar, Emeritus

The first financial vice president of the university, Dick was appointed to the position in 1961. Except for interludes, including advanced study and war service in which he rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel, he has served the university since 1931. He holds both bachelor and master degrees from Idaho, and has a second master degree in business administration from Stanford University. In addition, he is a Certified Public Accountant. Widely recognized for his ability as a university administrator, he is past president of the National Association of College and University Business Officers. Throughout the years, Dick has had a major role in the achievement of much that is the University of Idaho.

Colette W. Farrar, Extension Home Economics Agent

A graduate of Oregon State University, Mrs. Farrar had a distinguished career as an elementary teacher and home economics teacher in Idaho before joining the Idaho Agricultural Extension staff in 1956. Since that time she has done work with Indians at Fort Hall. She has given most distinguished service to youth and families on the Fort Hall reservation. Her influence and her help will remain a landmark for those she served and to those who follow.

Marion Featherstone, Associate Professor of Home Economics, Emerita

For 35 years Marion Featherstone has served as a distinguished teacher of art, crafts, and historic costume in the Home Economics Department. She has worked with the Women's Clubs of Idaho in promoting art programs, especially for children. Her knowledge has made her counsel invaluable in executing costumes for university dramatic productions.

Hilda Frederick, Extension Home Management Specialist

Miss Frederick retired in December, 1966. After graduation from Utah State University and the University of California she began her career in the Idaho Agricultural Extension Service in 1935. She served as home demonstration agent and district home demonstration agent until 1953, at which time she became home management specialist. Her assistance to rural and urban families, including youth, did much to improve family living through better management of family resources.

Robert F. Greene, Director of Housing

Robert F. Greene began his career in university administration in 1929 when he returned to Idaho as a student and proctor at Ridenbaugh Hall, a dormitory for men at that time. In 1931 he also became the manager of Lindley Hall. From this grew his responsibility as director of housing. He obtained a degree in education in 1932 and earned a master's degree in psychology in 1937. The direction Greene gave to the problems of housing Idaho students, both single and with families, compensates for his lost ambition to complete medical school and specialize in psychiatry.

Milton C. Grover, Extension Agricultural Agent

Milton Grover, agricultural agent in Oneida county since 1944, retired in December 1966. A graduate of Ricks College and the University of Idaho, he served as agent in Oneida county during his entire professional life for the university. He was highly influential in the development of agricultural programs in cereals and livestock which greatly influenced the agriculture in the county over the years.

Mildred C. Haberly, State Extension Home Economics Leader

Mildred C. Haberly, State Extension Home Economics leader, retired in December 1966. A graduate of Oregon State University, Miss Haberly joined the Idaho Extension staff in 1941 as home demonstration agent in Bannock county. She served as state extension nutrition specialist for ten years and state leader of home economics for fourteen years. Miss Haberly was the guiding influence in the development of significant home economics and youth programs for the people of Idaho.

Harry C. Harmsworth, Professor of Sociology, Emeritus

Professor Harmsworth came to the university in 1944. Since then his researches in the field of alcoholism and his demographic studies of Idaho have contributed directly to sound policy development in these fields by the state. As an authority on family problems, thousands of students will profit by his counsel.

Kenneth Hoag, Professor of English, Emeritus

Professor Hoag, who came to the University in 1935, performed the incredible feat of preparing texts for freshman composition in the days when teaching loads left little time. From 1947 to 1953 he was Head of the Department of Humanities. He has published a number of dialogs on the problems of being an instructor and those of being an administrator. A series of these dialogs is used in courses offered by many universities for the training of their teaching assistants and inexperienced instructors.

John J. Miller, Professor of Physics, Emeritus

Professor Miller joined the University of Idaho as Chairman of Physics in 1952. During his chairmanship an impressive research program has been developed and a doctoral program has been inaugurated. The growth in size and stature of the physics program has been such that it will acquire independent departmental status this year.

Elsine Nielsen, Associate Professor of Home Economics, Emerita

Miss Nielsen came to the University of Idaho in 1942, and has rendered outstanding service in teaching textiles, clothing and tailoring. Miss Nielsen studied textiles, design and fabrics on a tour of the fashion centers of Paris and Rome. Having studied with Edna Bishop, she not only pioneered in the Bishop Method of Clothing Construction at Idaho, but has conducted many workshops in this method.

Theodore J. Prichard, Professor of Art and Architecture, Emeritus

Professor Prichard joined the University of Idaho faculty in 1926. A Fellow of the American Institute of Architects and head of the Department of Art and Architecture, he will retire from teaching but not from architecture. He is respected as a counselor and has maintained a close relationship with his students through the years. As a licensed architect and as a teacher, he has "built well with mortar and men."

Agnes Crawford Schuldt, Professor of Music, Emerita

Miss Schuldt, throughout her 24 years at the University of Idaho, has actively promoted Fine Arts. She has served as chairman of the Fine Arts Committee and the Fine Arts Festival and has held office in the American Musicology Society. She is well known as a performer, lecturer-recitalist. Many of her piano students have gone on to graduate school and are now teaching in colleges. Her scholarly work in music history has honored the university.

Lloyd H. Scrivner, Professor of Veterinary Medicine, Emeritus

Dr. Scrivner joined the University of Idaho in 1948 as Professor and Head of the Department of Veterinary Science. He has influenced and helped many young men and women as advisor to pre-veterinary students. Many of these young people have gone on to a D.V.M. degree and are practicing veterinary medicine in Idaho or elsewhere. He has made many significant contributions to Idaho livestock people through his research on animal parasites and animal diseases.

Theodore A. Sherman, Professor of English, Emeritus

Professor Sherman, on the university faculty since 1931, has become an authority on technical writing in the United States through authorship of a text. He has also been identified with Victorian literature at the University of Idaho. On many occasions he has been called upon to perform extra duties, including those of athletics director during World War II and of director of the lower-division advisory program of his college.

Thomas Rex Walenta, Professor of Law, Emeritus

Dr. Walenta joined the faculty of the College of Law as Associate Professor in 1947. He became professor of law in 1953. A recognized authority in irrigation and mining law, he is known by his students as a kindly, patient teacher whose office door was always open for a student in need of help.

J. Frederick Weltzin, Dean and Professor of Education, Emeritus

Dr. J. Frederick Weltzin came to the University of Idaho in 1944 as Dean of the College of Education. During his 19 years as dean the college enrollment increased from 192 to 987 students. Since 1963, he has been professor and Dean, Emeritus, of the College of Education. Recognized as one of the nation's authorities on school law, he pursued his career in North Dakota, New York, and Colorado before coming to Idaho. He retires after 45 years of service to education, 23 with the University of Idaho.

Lewis M. Williams, District Extension Agent Supervisor

Lewis M. Williams, a graduate of the University of Idaho, began his extension career as agricultural agent in Jefferson county in 1934. Since 1946 he has been district extension agent supervisor for southwestern and central Idaho. Under his leadership many young agents and youths have developed into influential leaders in Idaho and in other states. He has been responsible for planning and executing many programs of significance to Idaho people. Perhaps no other person has done as much in the development of the 4-H club camp program in Idaho.

Lee F. Zimmerman, Librarian, Emeritus

Librarian Lee F. Zimmerman retires after 19 years service to the university. Under his leadership the University Library was able to accomplish four major goals, the greatest of which was the construction of the new Library. Other milestones include the organization of Library Associates, the establishment of the "Bookmark," and the creation of the Basque collection on the history, language and culture of the Basque people.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACH-ELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve. and wear no the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree-for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.

HONOR CORDS Honor Cords draped over the shoulders designate the students who are graduating with honors; cum laude with silver cords and summa cum laude with gold cords. These are recognition cords and are worn on this one occasion only—they are not part of the academic costume. Honor Cords are provided by the Honor

Society of Phi Kappa Phi.
