Significance of Academic Costume

DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap.

MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size.

BACHELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small.

UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood.

Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree — for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.

HONOR CORDS draped over the shoulders designate the students who are graduating with honors; cum laude with silver cords and summa cum laude with gold cords. These are recognition cords and are worn on this one occasion only — they are not part of the academic costume.

Honor Cords are provided by the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi.

Citations of Merit Upon Retirement

Merrill E. Deters, Professor Emeritus of Forestry

Dr. Deters devoted his 31 year career at the University of Idaho to full-time teaching in Forest Management and Silviculture, the study of forests and trees. A native of Goodhue, Minnesota, Dr. Deters received his B.S. degree in Forestry from the University of Minnesota in 1928. He continued his graduate work at the University of Minnesota and received his masters degree in 1930 and his Ph.D. in 1940. While at the University of Minnesota, he also worked as assistant forest inspector for the U.S. Forest Service. In 1935 Dr. Deters worked at the U.S. Forest Service, Washington, D.C., as an assistant to the chief forester, and associate forester for the Soil Erosion Service. Dr. Deters joined the staff of the university's College of Forestry in 1940 after four and one-half years of teaching at Michigan State College and five years of teaching at the University of Minnesota. In 1940 he also became Director of the University Experimental Forest. Dr. Deters was elected a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and is a member of several honoraries including Sigma Xi, national science honorary, Phi Sigma Society, a national biological sciences honorary, and Alpha Zeta, agriculture service honorary.

Raphael S. Gibbs, Professor of Journalism, Director of Information and University Editor Emeritus

Portraying the University of Idaho as the educational and cultural center of the State of Idaho was the task of Rafe Gibbs. In his duties as teacher, writer, speaker and historian for the University of Idaho, Gibbs dedicated a quarter-century of life to making the citizens of Idaho

aware of the educational and service programs available to them within their own state. He became a strong and influential figure in aiding the direction of his alma mater. Graduating with highest honors in 1934, Gibbs served the university as Director of Sports Publicity and Editor of Publications before being named Director of Information, University Editor and Professor in 1949. He is the author of Beacon For Mountain and Plain, the story of the University of Idaho, which was published in 1962. In addition to being a book author, he has will more than 200 articles for national magazines and is the author of the Idaho section in the International Encyclopedia. He has served as consultant to two New York public relations firms and is listed in Who's Who in Public Relations and Who's Who in the West in addition to numerous writer listings. A member of Phi Beta Kappa he belongs to the American Public Relations Association and was a recent recipient of ACPRA's 25-year "Seasons Sage" award.

Frank E. Hackler, Associate Extension Professor of Agriculture

Mr. Hackler has done much for the farmer in Washington County while acting as County Extension Agent. A graduate of Oregon State University, Mr. Hackler spent several years as Assistant Agent in Umatilla County, Oregon, before coming to Idaho in 1946. He has been of the prime motivating forces in expanding grassland agriculture in Washington County. He is credited with expanding beef production in the county, as well as establishing a range bull grading program, and 10 years ago Mr. Hackler helped organize the Weiser River Cattlemen's Association.

L Hansen, Assistant Extension Professor Emerita of Home Economics

Is Hansen was first employed by the Co-operative blension Service of the University of Idaho in 1947 as Extension Home Economics Agent in Bonneville County. 1964, Mrs. Hansen was transferred to Oneida County and remained there until her retirement in 1970. She eceived her B.S. degree in Home Economics from Utah State University in 1929. After graduation, and until she aned the staff of the Extension Service, she worked as a fiods and Nutritions Teacher in Richmond, Utah, and for period of years in the Farm Security Administration in leston and Rigby, Idaho. She assumed primary soonsibility for the formation of County Home Demonstration disory Councils in Bonneville County. While working in recapacity of home agent in Oneida County, she developed a moram to show the homemakers in the county the value of sound nutrition and health.

Hubert E. Hattrup, Professor of Electrical Engineering and Department Head Emeritus

The service of Professor Hattrup to the university began 1941 as an instructor of Electrical Engineering where hehas served with distinction in all positions of academic ank. Of special note is the period of his service from 1953 - 1966 during which time he served as the Head of the Department of Electrical Engineering. A native of Kenterville, Idaho, Professor Hattrup attended the University of Idaho and received his B.S. degree in Electrical Engineering in 1930. He then spent ten years n industry before returning to the University of Idaho. His activity in regional engineering societies serves only note the interest he has always shown in the University of Idaho. During 1960-1961 he served as chairman of the Institute of Electrical & Electronic Engineers (IEEE), Spokane Section. Professor Hattrup is a member of IEEE, Idaho Society of Professional Engineers, American Society for Engineering Education and Sigma Tau, the National Engineering honorary.

J. Irving Jolley, Professor Emeritus of Chemistry

Or Jolley's distinguished service at the University of Idaho first began in 1937, when he joined the University of daho's Department of Chemistry as an instructor. In 1943, he was advanced to the rank of assistant professor, and after serving three years in the Navy he returned to the university (1947) and was elevated to the rank of full professor. In 1953, he became chairman of pre-medical and pre-dental studies in addition to which, since 1957, he has taught freshman chemistry. Dr. Jolley is a native of Seattle, Washington, and received both his bachelor of science and doctor of philosophy degrees from the University of Washington. He is a fellow of the American Institute of Chemistry and a member of numerous professional organizations. Dr. Jolley will long be remembered as the man responsible for so many of the successes of university students as they went on to find careers in medicine and dentistry.

Mabel Locke, Professor Emerita of Physical Education

Professor Locke's career as a teacher of physical education has taken her to many different academic environments across the United States, but the University of Idaho is particularly lucky that she decided in 1947 to return as an associate professor and head of Physical Education for

Women. She had taught six years, then left the university in 1936. That year she received the M.S. degree from the University of Wisconsin after earning a B.S. degree in 1929 from Northwestern University. She was awarded a physical therapy certificate in 1945 from Northwestern University Medical School. In 1952, following her return to the University of Idaho, she became Chairman of Physical Education for Women, a position she held until 1969. In addition to her academic activities, she has served as president of the American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation. In 1968-69 Professor Locke received a distinguished service award from the Idaho Association for Health, Physical Education & Recreation. Her contributions to the profession of physical education and the University of Idaho will long be remembered.

Gilbert Matson, Associate Extension Professor Emeritus of Agriculture

A native of Burley, Gilbert Matson has a long association with farming, the university, and the State of Idaho. He began his college education at the university, but was interrupted when he returned to farming. After six years he returned and earned a degree in agriculture in 1940. Upon graduation he served as Vocational Agriculture teacher in Rigby for two years, and in 1942 he was appointed agent for Gem County. In 1945, after leaving the extension service and entering business, he returned to the extension service at Payette and has since been chairman of the county staff. His term of service and association with the university has seen his participation in many projects that will benefit all of Idaho. Mr. Matson has organized and directed many developments in farming, rural-urban cooperation and programs of 4-H clubs.

G. Elbert McProud, Associate Professor of Agricultural Education and Extension Studies and Training Specialist Emeritus

During his career in extension work for the University of Idaho, Elbert McProud was actively involved in many different extension activities. He was instrumental in helping to establish the Achievement Days and the 4-H Leader Councils in Latah County. He also was deeply involved with the formation of various commodity group associations in Latah County. Mr. McProud received his B.S. degree in Agriculture in 1934 and his M.S. degree in the same field in 1940 from the University of Idaho. Before joining the extension staff upon completion of his M.S. degree in 1940 he taught for a number of years in the public schools of northcentral Idaho. Prior to transferring to Latah County in 1945, he was an extension agent in Both Clearwater and Boundary Counties. Over the years Elbert McProud has been an active recruiter for his Alma Mater and has personally served as counselor and friend to many of the young Idahoans attending the University of Idaho.

Marjorie M. Neely, Dean of Women Emerita

A native Idahoan, Marjorie Neely first became acquainted with the University of Idaho when she enrolled as an undergraduate in 1924. She studied here for just two years, and then a number of years later returned to college to receive her B.A. in Education in 1948 from Eastern Washington State College. In 1950 she received her M.A. in Human Relations from Ohio University and during her last year there served as assistant to the Dean

of Women. During the next few years, she traveled to several different colleges, but returned to the University of Idaho in 1957 as Associate Director of Student Affairs for Women, and in 1960 accepted the position of Dean of Women. Mrs. Neely has been active as a member in many honoraries and associations relating to her work including: National Association of Women Deans and Counselors, American College Personnel Association, and Psi Chi, the national psychology honorary. Her devotion to and interest in the development and welfare of women as well as men students will long be appreciated and remembered by all members of the University of Idaho community.

H. Robert Otness, Professor Emeritus of Psychology

Service and dedication to the education of Idaho's handicapped in the many related fields of psychology are the hallmarks of a 21-year career for Dr. H. Robert Otness at the University of Idaho. Dr. Otness came to Idaho in 1950 from Rainier School, Buckley, Washington, where he was Director of Research and Training. Twenty-one years later his programs and service for the mentally retarded, visually handicapped, acoustically impaired, physically crippled, speech impaired as well as the mentally gifted loom as great milestones in the State of Idaho's efforts to keep pace with the needs of her citizenry. Through the efforts of Dr. Otness many Idaho students were introduced into the fields of mental illness and the problems of social psychology. Receiving his Ph.D. from New York University, Dr. Otness served as chief clinical psychologist at the Training School, Vineland, N. J. He later served with the U.S. Navy prior to his service to the Rainier School before coming to the

University of Idaho. A member of Phi Beta Kappa and Phi Delta Kappa, Dr. Otness is also an honorary member of Mu Epsilon Delta (MED), U. of I. honorary. In professional organizations he is one of a select few Idahoans who are Diplomate in Clinical Psychology, America Board of Professional Examiners in Psychology, and a fellow in the American Psychological Association and the American Association on Mental Deficiency. He is also a member of the International Council on Exceptional Children and is a charter member of both the Washington and Idaho State Psychological Associations.

William H. Tenney, Associate Professor Emeritus

Dr. Tenney, an Idaho poet and associate professor of English has served the university for a total of 22 years and he will long be remembered for the poetry he has written and the service he has given while a member the University of Idaho faculty. Before coming to the University of Idaho, Dr. Tenney taught at a number of institutions including, Oberlin College, Edison Institute of Technology, University of Michigan and Champlain College He graduated Cum Laude with honors in English from Oberlin College in 1929, received his M.A. from the University of Michigan in 1943. A member of numerou professional societies including National Council of Teacher of English and the Modern Language Association, Dr. Tenney has still found time to direct many programs a the University of Idaho. Among them are the English honors program and the freshman composition program as well as acting as an advisor within the Department of English.
