Dedication

This Commencement program is dedicated to three distinguished deans of the University, two of whom became president of the University, and all of whom died within the last academic year — Drs. Donald R. Theophilus, Harrison C. Dale and David D. Kendrick.

Dr. Theophilus, born in Pittsburgh, Pa., long ago came to love Idaho, and was devoted especially to the University of Idaho, which he served for 38 years, retiring as president emeritus in 1965. He was the first president ever to retire from the University. In 1927, Dr. Theophilus was appointed associate professor of dairying at the University, moving up to head of the department in 1935. He became dean of agriculture in 1946, acting president of the University in 1954, and president in 1955. For his accomplishments, he received various and significant tributes. These included Outstanding Graduate Award of his alma mater, Iowa State University, from which he held four degrees. The Idaho State Legislature passed a resolution honoring him, and three institutions of higher learning presented him with honorary doctorate degrees. They were the College of Idaho, Gonzaga University and the University of Idaho. Of all the honors, the one he appreciated most was the honorary doctorate from the University of Idaho.

"At last," he said, "I am legally entitled to wear the silver and gold of Idaho."

In 1925, Dr. Dale became the first dean of the College of Business and Economics, originally established as the School of Business Administration. Dr. Dale was an outstanding teacher, and actually the school was established partly to keep him at Idaho. But Dr. Dale did not look upon the school as a holding action, and, with his pioneering efforts, it rapidly gained status of significance. In 1928, Dr. Dale resigned to accept a similar post at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. He returned to the University of Idaho in 1937 to become the institution's ninth president, serving in this capacity until 1946. It was he who successfully piloted the University through the difficult years of World War II.

Dr. Kendrick, in 1957, became the fourth dean of the College of Business and Economics, the first graduate of the University to hold this position. In 1959, the Bureau of Business and Economic Research was established in association with the college, and Dr. Kendrick was named its first director, serving in this capacity until his death in addition to administering the college as dean. In this dual role, Dr. Kendrick, with a keen interest in his native State of Idaho, became widely known for his leadership in its economic development. To further this interest, he served as president of both the North Idaho Chamber of Commerce and Moscow Chamber of Commerce. Idaho is a better state because of him.

Citations of Merit Upon Retirement

Ruth Anderson, Associate Professor Emerita of Office Administration

Idaho, particularly the University of Idaho, has been the life of Ruth Anderson. A native of Moscow, she was graduated from the University in 1926, and received her master's degree from the institution in 1941. For years, she was a commercial teacher in high schools at Challis, Genesee and Coeur d'Alene. In 1946, she joined the faculty of the College of Business and Economics at the University as an instructor, rising to the rank of associate professor. Keenly interested in the advancement of youth, she was an advisor for Alpha Lambda Delta, freshman women's honorary.

James L. Botsford, Associate Professor Emeritus of Mathematics

Dr. James L. Botsford holds an A.B. degree magna cum laude from the University of Washington and a Ph.D degree cum laude from the California Institute of Technology. Before coming to Idaho in 1949, he was on the faculty of Eastern Washington College of Education, Reed College and San Jose State College. Perhaps as fine a tribute as has been paid to him came from Professor of Mathematics Frank L. Griffin of Reed College: "He gave real intellectual stimulus to the best students and at the same time was remarkably successful with those who had difficulties with mathematics." He was active in Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honorary, and Sigma Xi, national scientific honorary.

Iva A. Burnstad, Assistant Extension Professor and Bonner County Home Economics Agent, Cooperative Extension Service

Iva A. Burnstad retired as Bonner County's Extension home economics agent on February 28. She had given outstanding service to Bonner County since 1961, and before that she did the same for Benewah County for two years. Before coming to Idaho, Miss Burnstad was a dietitian in the Army Medical Corps, worked for a power company in South Dakota and for the Farmers Home Administration and the Dairy Council in Wyoming. She attended North Dakota State Teachers College, the University of North Dakota, Iowa State College and the University of Wyoming.

A native of Des Moines, Iowa, Dr. Virgil A. Cherrington gave 42 years of distinguished service to the University of Idaho. Joining the faculty in 1928, he rose through the ranks to professor and head of the Department of Bacteriology. A graduate of Iowa State University, he held a M.S. degree from the University of Idaho and a Ph.D. degree from Iowa State University. Joining the University of Idaho faculty in 1928, he rose through the ranks to professor and head of the Department of Bacteriology in 1946. Thousands of former students throughout the world remember Dr. Cherrington as an exacting professor, and are grateful to him that he was. He was personally interested in each one. This interest in youth made him an outstanding proctor of the Idaho Club, a cooperative dormitory, during the Depression Thirties. The fame of Idaho's cooperative dormitories spread throughout the nation, and Dr. Cherrington played an important role in their success.

Oscar O. Christianson, Professor Emeritus of Bacteriology

Dr. Oscar O. Christianson, who is a graduate of St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota, holds a M.D. degree from Rush Medical College, Chicago, but his love for youth led him to the teaching field rather than to the practice of medicine. Before coming to the University of Idaho in 1949, he taught at Rush Medical College and the Medical School of the University of Alabama. He was also active in the Medical Reserve Corps. While at the University of Idaho, Dr. Christianson was in charge of the clinical training of the institution's medical technology students at St. Luke's Hospital in Spokane, establishing a relationship that has brought great credit to both University and Hospital.

Rex M. Collier, Professor Emeritus of Psychology

The service of Dr. Rex M. Collier at the University of Idaho was short — four years — but in that period he left his mark as a distinguished professor of psychology. A graduate of State University of Iowa, he holds M.A. and Ph.D degrees from Northwestern University. Before joining the Idaho faculty in 1966, he taught at Washington University in St. Louis, Washington State University, University of Illinois, Union College, University of Vermont, John Fletcher College and Northwestern University Medical School. He also served as chief of the Neuropsychiatric Laboratory, Veterans Administration Hospital, St. Louis; chief of Psychological Service, Jefferson Barracks Veterans Administration Hospital; senior counselor, Vocational Counseling Service, Yale Institute of Human Relations, and chief psychologist at various Army stations during World War II.

Herman G. Hilfiker, Extension Professor and Ada County Extension Agent Emeritus, Cooperative Extension Service

Herman Hilfiker has been counseling farmers for 33 years as an Extension county agent. He was appointed as agent in Bannock County in 1936, transferred to Bingham County in 1938, and served in Ada County from 1942 until his retirement. He is a native Nebraskan who grew up in Filer, Idaho. He helped many changes take place on the agricultural scene of Ada County during the 28 years he served there, and he leaves the farming practices much better than they were when he came to the area.

Mary B. Kirkwood, Professor Emerita of Art

Mary B. Kirkwood has devoted most of her life to teaching art at the University of Idaho, joining the faculty in 1930 as an instructor and rising to professor. Holding a B.A. degree from the University of Montana and a M.F.A. degree from the University of Oregon, she also did advanced studies at Harvard University and the Royal Art School, Stockholm, Sweden. Her art has been exhibited throughout the nation, with Boston and York, Pennsylvania, included among the sites of one-man shows. She has also exhibited in New York City, San Francisco, Seattle, Salt Lake City and Colorado Springs. "Best of Show" honors have been received at Spokane, Boise and Lewiston. However, she takes greatest pride in the success of her students. At the University, her own art will live on with murals in the Library and Agricultural Science buildings.

James M. Lyle, Alumni Secretary

Of James M. Lyle it is often said that "there is only one — there could not be another like him." If ever an award is given for the person who has been the nation's friendliest alumni secretary, "Jim" Lyle will probably win it. Too, he is Idaho —all Idaho. A native of Peck, he received B.S. and M.S. (Ed.) degrees from the University of Idaho. Before being appointed alumni secretary at the University, he spent 13 years as an Idaho teacher and school superintendent, serving at Peck, Southwick, Kendrick and Grangeville, and rising to assistant state superintendent of schools at Boise. During World War II, he served as an officer in the Army. Upon his retirement from the university, he was honored by the American Alumni Council as well as by the Idaho Alumni Association. Alumni and friends added a new automobile to the tributes.

Mrs. Dorothy Stephens, Extension Professor and State Home Economics Leader Emerita, Cooperative Extension Service

Mrs. Dorothy Stephens concluded a more than 30-year professional career when she retired. She served as county and district home economics agent, as assistant state leader, and, the last three years, as state leader. She won a distinguished service award from the National Home Demonstration Agents' Association, an award for superior service from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and an outstanding work award from Epsilon Sigma Phi, professional honorary for Extension staff members.

George W. Woodbury, Professor Emeritus of Horticulture

When horticulture is discussed in the West, the name of Dr. George W. Woodbury is likely to come up in the conversation as a distinguished contributor to development. The same is true in Ecuador, because Dr. Woodbury gave of his talents to improve the agriculture of that country when the University of Idaho conducted a good neighbor project there. A native of St. Johns, Michigan, he received B.S. and M.S. degrees from Michigan State University and his doctorate from Cornell University. Before first coming to the University of Idaho in 1935, he engaged in professional landscape gardening in Atlanta, Georgia, and served on the faculty at Texas Technological College in Lubbock. At Idaho he rose up the ranks to professor and head of the Department of Horticulture.

Carol Youngstrom, Extension Professor and Associate Director Emeritus, Cooperative Extension Service

Carol Youngstrom served in the Idaho Agricultural Extension Service for 25 years. He joined the University of Idaho faculty as an agricultural economics instructor and member of the Experiment Station staff. After a year of advanced work at the University of California, he was appointed Extension economist and marketing specialist. Five years later he was appointed associate director. Under his leadership, Idaho became one of the first states to provide area specialists. His contributions to agriculture in the state will long stand as marks of merit.

Fund for the Performing Arts Center

Creativity in all its forms is the life blood of a university. Without it there can be no generation of new ideas, no research, no re-interpretation of old concepts, no great writing, and little, if any, truly inspired teaching. If a university graduate has not been led into creative paths by his exposure to higher education, be these paths in science, medicine, agriculture, business, education, or the arts, then it is quite likely that for him the experience has been largely a waste of time.

The response to the creative vision of the Performing Arts Center on the University of Idaho campus gained impetus this year, as the nationwide campaign raised the total funds to a figure approaching three-quarters of a million dollars. During the past academic year the Campaign for the Performing Arts Center was extended into Montana and Illinois. Plans are being formulated for continued extension of the nationwide drive into areas in which there is an alumni concentration.

FPAC: Response to the Development of Creativity

FOUNDATION GIFTS: During the past year the Fund for the Performing Arts Center received an enthusiastic response from regional foundations. A gift of \$100,000 was received from the George Frederick Jewett Foundation of Spokane, Washington. The Jewett Foundation gift is the expression of continued interest of family members in the University of Idaho. "We know that this will give renewed vigor to volunteers across the country who are seeking to establish this significant addition to the university campus and curriculum," University President Ernest W. Hartung commented. "It is obvious that the new Performing Arts Center will enrich the cultural life of the campus and the whole Northwest, and will provide a new incentive for academic attainments in the performing arts." Another "challenge" foundation gift was received for FPAC as the total contributions of the Henry L. Day Foundation of Wallace, Idaho, rose to \$10,000. Other foundation gifts included \$1,250 from the Henry W. Morrison Family Foundation, Inc., of Boise, Idaho.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACHELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree — for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.

HONOR CORDS

Honor Cords draped over the shoulders designate the students who are graduating with honors; cum laude with silver cords and summa cum laude with gold cords. These are recognition cords and are worn on this one occasion only — they are not part of the academic costume.

Honor Cords are provided by the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi.

While you are visiting on the University campus, your attention is invited to the fountain and reflecting pool on the mall between the Library and the University Classroom Center. This scenic spot has been dedicated by the Associated Students to Dr. H. Walter Steffens, Academic Vice President Emeritus of the University of Idaho. He served the university for 41 years.
