# **AWARDS**

AMERICAN HISTORY ESSAY CONTEST—Scoring three points, the Idaho Club placed first among campus groups in the seventeenth annual contest sponsored by the Sons of the American Revolution, thereby winning possession for the coming year of a bust of Washington designed by Bianchini. A silver medal is awarded to Margaret Edlefsen of Boise for her essay, "We Establish Freedom of the Press." Second prize, also a silver medal, is awarded to Lester Raymond Smith of Notus for his essay on "Patrick Henry: His Role in the Fight for Independence." A silver medal is awarded as third prize to Albert Martin of Sandpoint for his essay, "The George Rogers Clark Expedition: An Adventure in the West."

CIVIL ENGINEERING—Three prizes are awarded annually by the Northwestern Society of Highway Engineers for the best professional papers submitted by senior engineering students in the states of Washington, Idaho, and Oregon. First prize of \$15 was won this year by Harold S. Davis of Shelley for his paper, "Frost Heaving and Its Prevention," and third prize of \$5 by Jack A. Love of Boise for his paper, "Esthetics of Short-Span Highway Bridges."

Junior membership in the American Society of Civil Engineers is awarded to John F. Erdle of Wallace for his professional paper, "Investigation of Slope Stability by Shear Test," in the annual contest sponsored by the Spokane section of the society.

MECHANICAL ENGINEERING—Junior membership in the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, plus \$5 in cash, is awarded to Elmer M. Johnston of Plummer for his professional paper, "Braking High-Speed Trains," in the annual contest sponsored by the Spokane section of the society. Junior membership in the society is awarded to A. Glenn Harding of Grangeville for his professional paper, "Cathode Ray Oscillograph for Engine Indication."

FRENCH SCHOLARSHIP—A bronze medal given by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the French Republic through its consul-general at San Francisco is Awarded to Margaret Garretson of Boise as the outstanding student of the French language and French literature for the past year.

THE PHILO SHERMAN BENNETT PRIZE is awarded annually for the best essay on a subject dealing with "The Principles of Free Government." For the year 1939-40 first prize is awarded to Eda Hillman of Boise for her essay on "Issues in the 1940 Campaign," and second prize to William Dean Mayes of Meridian for his essay on "Agriculture: A Governmental Problem Since 1920."

POPE ORATORICAL CONTEST—Sponsored by former United States Senator James P. Pope. First prize of \$25 is awarded to Harry Lewies of St. Anthony; second prize of \$15 to Vernon Ravenscroft of Twin Falls; and third prize of \$10 to Melvin Alsager of Potlatch. The winner has his name inscribed on a bronze tablet and will represent the University in the Pacific Forensic League Oratorical Contest.
