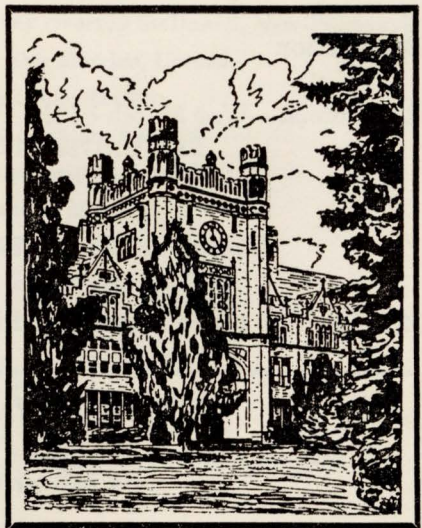

BOYER PLAQUE—Mrs. Katy Rae Boyer has provided a plaque upon which is engraved the name of the senior woman graduating with a major in Physical Education who has the highest four-year scholastic average. Linda Jacobsen Renn, Nampa, was the winner of this honor for 1963.

RAYMOND J. BRIGGS AWARD—In honor of a distinguished member, the Idaho Society of Professional Engineers has instituted an annual award for the graduating engineering student who not only demonstrates high professional potential but scores very high in the Engineering-in-Training examination taken in May. The award is a large plaque with the name of each year's winner inscribed upon it; in addition, the winner receives a small plaque with his name engraved upon it.

CHEMICAL AND ENGINEERING NEWS MERIT AWARD—The publication *Chemical and Engineering News* makes twelve nation wide awards to undergraduates in chemistry and chemical engineering who combined outstanding achievement in extra-curricular activity with high scholastic attainment. SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACHELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree—for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.
