Citations of Merit Upon Retirement

William C. Banks, Professor of English, Emeritus

Except during intervals of study at University of Washington and in England, Professor William C. Banks has served the University of Idaho in the field of English since 1927. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and various professional organizations. For one semester, he was Acting Head of the Department of English. With a fine sense of humor, he has been a stimulating teacher, especially in literature of the Restoration and Eighteenth Century, the English Novel, and Creative Writing. He has earned the gratitude of multitudes of students for his warm personal interest and his willingness to give them individual attention far beyond the call of duty.

Ruth H. Boas, Assistant Professor of English

Professor Ruth H. Boas has taught English at the University of Idaho since 1958 after previously serving as a teacher in Emmett and Moscow. Her work, especially in Business Writing, has earned the respect of her colleagues, and three citations by students for her contributions to their education. Her honesty, tact, and sound judgment have given her great influence among her departmental colleagues and the members of several student-faculty committees. Her esteem among students and her devotion to their interests are shown by her having been advisor to several student organizations. She understands young people, and has devoted most of her life to helping them to better understanding.

Francis J. Boyle, Athletic Trainer

"Packey" Boyle has completed 13 years at the University of Idaho. He came to the University athletic program from Sun Valley, where he was trainer for the famous resort. In 1960, he was named trainer of the U.S. Olympic team in the Squaw Valley, Calif., winter Olympics. He kept Idaho teams in top mental as well as physical shape through his concern for each individual in the athletic program, and each individual had a good word for Packey. The City of Moscow honored him February 26 of this year by proclaiming "Packey Boyle Day."

Paul D. Dalke, Leader of the Idaho Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit. Emeritus

Dr. Dalke is the holder of three degrees in his field from the University of Michigan. As leader of the Idaho Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit, he probed deeply for two decades into the life and habits of a wide variety of the State's animals and birds, including bighorn sheep, mountain goats, deer, elk, sage grouse and waterfowl. A pioneer in the Wildlife Research Unit program established by the federal government, Dr. Dalke became leader of the Connecticut unit in 1935. Two years later, he moved to Missouri to head the unit there. He began serving Idaho in 1947. His research has resulted in more than 50 technical publications, providing a major contribution to man's knowledge of wildlife.

Gale L. Mix, General Manager, Associated Students

Gale Mix was more than a staff member of the University of Idaho for a quarter century. He was a tradition. Knowing him was part of attending the University. A native of Moscow and a graduate of the College of Law, he gained valuable experience in diplomatic dealings with people by serving as a major during World War II on General Eisenhower's staff at Supreme Allied Headquarters. For his service as liaison officer with British troops, he was awarded the Order of the British Empire. Before working with University of Idaho students, he was a successful athletic coach at Declo and Moscow high schools. In the three years he coached at Moscow High School, he turned out two champion basketball teams and two undefeated football teams.

John A. Snider, Chairman and Professor of Elementary Education, Emeritus

Professor Snider gave 18 years of distinguished service to the College of Education. Born in Custer, Oklahoma, in Cheyenne-Arapaho Indian Territory, he was graduated from the University of Oklahoma. He received his master's degree from Oklahoma and his doctorate from the University of Colorado. His teaching career began in 1924 as a grade and high school principal at Sterling, Oklahoma. After serving in the Grand Junction, Colorado, School System for many years, he came to the University of Idaho in 1949 and rose to the position of Chairman of Elementary Education. Throughout his career, he devoted much time to state and national educational associations. Among his many accomplishments for Idaho education has been his leadership role as Executive Secretary of the Idaho School Trustees Association.

Kathryn S. Woodbury, Instructor of Foreign Languages

Kathryn S. Woodbury has been a Spanish instructor in the Department of Foreign Languages since 1962 and a resident of Moscow for many additional years. Her B.A. degree was achieved at Elmira College in New York and her M.A. degree from the University of Maine where she also had her first teaching experience. She studied at the Universidad de los Andes in Bogota, Colombia, while her husband was on a faculty exchange professorship there. The Woodburys have traveled extensively, including a 1967 trip to Spain. During the past two years, Mrs. Woodbury has contributed outstanding service in the organization of the first Language House units in the University dormitories, and in the advising program for the College of Letters and Science.



Gifts

Many gifts are presented each year to the University of Idaho to provide for a greater institution or to aid students attending it. Scholarships are noted in the next section of this program, but it is desired to give recognition here to a wide variety of other gifts which have been received since last commencement.

STILLINGER GIFTS

Noted with special appreciation this year are the gifts from Charles Roy Stillinger and his late wife, the former Nettie Mae Bauer, graduates of the University and pioneer residents of Moscow. A trust, established by the Stillingers in 1957, has now grown until it totals \$560,556. Under the trust agreement, all income is assigned to the Stillingers until their deaths. Much of the income in the last decade, however, has been added to the trust. Mrs. Stillinger died October 27, 1967. Purposes of the trust are to establish a botanical and mycological herbarium, to provide scholarships for political science and American history students, and to establish a forest science research fellowship. In addition, Mr. Stillinger established in 1968 the Nettie Mae Stillinger Syringa Girls State Scholarship Fund with a gift of \$12,254, which was augmented by \$1,858 in gifts sent by American Legion Auxiliary units and friends as memorials to Mrs. Stillinger. The fund is to provide scholarships at the University of Idaho for outstanding girls who have participated in Girls State. Mrs. Stillinger, who was an honor graduate of the University of Idaho and a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the national scholastic honorary, was also Moscow and state president of the Auxiliary of the American Legion which sponsors Girls State. She was a leader of Girls State from 1948 to 1963. The new contribution brings the total of Stillinger gifts to \$572,810.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACH-ELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRAD-UATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree—for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab. ACADEMIC SIGNIFICANCE OF

HONOR CORDS

HONOR CORDS
Honor Cords draped over the shoulders designate the students who are graduating with honors; cum laude with silver cords and summa cum laude with gold cords. These are recognition cords and are worn on this one occasion only — they are not part of the academic costume.

Honor Cords are provided by the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi.
