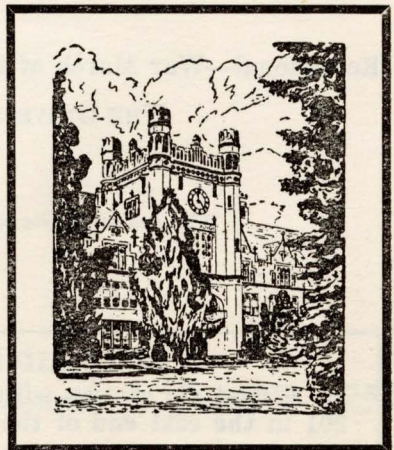

VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS AWARDS—The Veterans of Foreign Wars awards are presented annually to the advanced ROTC students of the Army, Navy and Air Force units considered by the professors of their respective services as having demonstrated the most promise of pursuing successful careers in the Armed Forces. The awards, in the sum of \$25 each, went to the following seniors: Army ROTC, Peter F. Stickney, Long Beach, Calif.; Air Force ROTC, William W. Gleaves, Salem, Ore.; and Navy ROTC, William Alan Tyksinski, Chicago, Ill.

WALL STREET JOURNAL STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD—The Wall Street Journal provides a medal and a one year's subscription to the "Wall Street Journal" to a graduating senior in Business Administration. The award is made on the basis of outstanding achievement in college work. The winner for 1953 was Richard Alan Johnston, Orofino.

WOODROW WILSON FELLOWSHIP—This fellowship is sponsored by the American Association of Universities, and provides \$1,250 plus tuition at any one of 37 universities in the association. Winner for 1953 was George Macinko, Nesquehoning, Pa., who will study at the University of Michigan.

XI SIGMA PI AWARD—The outstanding senior in the school of Forestry is presented an award of the initial membership fee in the Society of American Foresters and a year's subscription to the "Journal of Forestry." In addition, his name is engraved on a plaque which is on display in the Forestry building. Selection for this award is made on the basis of leadership, professional attainment, personality and promise of future achievement in professional work. Roger R. Bay, La Crosse, Wis., was selected to receive these honors.

Gifts

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACADEMIC COSTUMES is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods. DOCTORS wear the round, bell sleeve; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or velvet of color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he so choose, wear the gold tassel on his cap. MASTERS wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part for the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size. BACHELORS wear the long pointed sleeve; the hood is small. UNDERGRADUATES wear the round or pointed sleeve, and wear no hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree — for example, arts and letters, white; philosophy, blue; science, gold-yellow; music, pink; agriculture, maize; engineering, orange; forestry, russet; pedagogy, light blue; commerce and accounting, drab.
