I think my Father and Brother will help me go East this winter and I want to take out the heads you have and I will try to get a big price for them Mr. Davis is going down to see you in a short time. I think he will be down in less than three weeks.

Mr. Bacon told me of having seen you lately and I was gladte knew you were well. I felt werried about you this fall and was glad to knew you had company new and then. I just have you had enough to sat. I have ordered some seed for you and will get them down to you as soon as I can. I think you should have as much garden as you can so you can food the men with fresh stuff when they come.

It is getting late so I must close. Mr Garden is getting the mail ready. I sent you some tobacco and hope you recd it. I am Deputy Recorder and have the books. In haste
