Dear Mr. Crabtree:


This is a letter which I have intended to write for a long time but just never seem to have set down to it. I failed to make the meeting at the University of Illinois so we didn,t meet as planed.



From my efforts it would appear that there is a good deal of data in the literature which is in error. I notice that you have made similar observations in Pfeiffer,s work "The Emergence of Man". Although I can knap well enough can't seem to develop a technique for detaching flakes large enough or thin enough to produce large points. Would you care to share with me your tecknique for doing this.?

I demonstrate tool making to my students and have found that it gives them a better perspective of how early man dealt with his environment. I think it also helps to clear away some of the debris contained in the literature.
