Under separate cover I send you a reprint of my paper on the Stone Implement making of the Nakako Tribe.


We have just returned from a further field trip that was obtaining additional confirmatory information on some of their techniques.

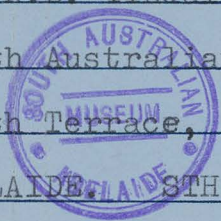
