And, it is appropriate to add, the possible future interest. For once your biography appears in any Marquis Who's Who reference volume, it will be perpetually available to future historians.

The Basic Principle Governing Selection for Who's Who Publications Before the first edition of *Who's Who in America* was published in 1897, the basic guiding principle was established to govern the selection of individuals for inclusion in the volume. Carefully designed to prevent selections based on personal whim or desire—either those of the editors, of would-be biographees, or of other advocates this criterion has been faithfully and objectively applied throughout the history of *Who's Who*. Only in this way has *Who's Who* been able to earn the recognition it enjoys as the hallmark of biographical reference ... and in the process, become an American institution.

There is no charge—nor is there any obligation whatsoever—for the inclusion of a biography in Who's Who, and there never has been. Neither money nor influence has ever determined a selection. And neither money nor any consideration—other than achievement, or eminence, or public position—can obtain a listing.

The Basic Principle Governing Selection

The primary objective of *Who's Who in America* was first articulated by Albert Nelson Marquis, its founder:

Who's Who in America shall endeavor to list those individuals who are of current national reference interest and inquiry either because of meritorious achievement in some reputable field of endeavor or because of positions they hold.

This has become the guiding principle governing selections for all *Who's Who* biographical reference works. Mere fame is not a criterion, nor is financial or social status sufficient reason for selection. Any of the foregoing must be accompanied by achievement, vocational position, or public service—and by significant reference interest.

The Two Categories of Eligibility

As set forth in the basic guiding principle, the criteria for selection divide the eligible into two groups:

I. Achievement

This group comprises individuals who have accomplished something noteworthy—something that distinguishes them from the vast majority of their contemporaries and renders them subject to considerable interest or inquiry. Customarily, they will have contributed significantly to their field, to human understanding, to civilization. Winners of major awards in each field are included—but they constitute only a small proportion of the achievement category.

A biographee might be an author whose writings possess more than ephemeral interest, but whose books may or may not have made the best-seller lists; a clergyman identified with some important idea or program but wihout high ecclesiastical rank; a composer or sculptor whose work is widely admired or significant but not widely known; a scientist conspicuous in the space program or sequestered in his laboratory. *Who's Who* recognizes that the nature of achievement is not defined by fame or fashion alone.

Who's Who reference volumes play an effective role in disseminating data on individuals whose work is well known or whose attainments give promise of fame.

II. Position

While a majority of the biographees in this group would be eligible by virtue of achievement, their selection is assured by the positions they occupy in—

government the law the military societies devoted to philanthropic, educational, and scientific purposes educational institutions religion finance and industry the communications media professional and collegiate athletics plus many other individuals likewise chosen

because of incumbency or membership.
