Yesterday morning, as planned I breakfasted with Lee and Florence Jaques just north of St. Paul.

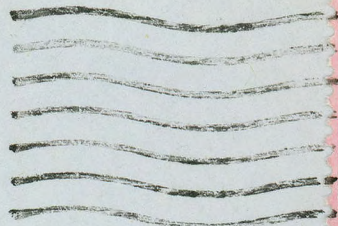
You would like them both and they

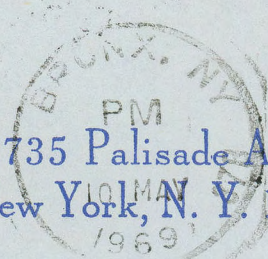
