The DICTIONARY OF INTERNATIONAL BIOGRAPHY, established in 1960 and first published in 1963, may now be consulted in the major National and State Libraries of the world and in thousands of other libraries. It is acknowledged as a leading work of biographical reference and, because it is so *international*, enjoys the official patronage of Heads of State and Government. A special feature is the copyrighted "coding" which provides, at a glance, reference to all other important books in which you are listed. For the eleventh successive year, the Hon. General Editor of the DICTIONARY OF INTERNATIONAL BIOGRAPHY is Ernest Kay, D.Litt., of Cambridge, England, Life Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts (London) and of the Accademia Filologia Classica (Milan); Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society (London); recipient of the Key to the City of New York; and author of biographical and other books.
