Arrangements have been made to produce, entirely by hand, the superb Royal Edition of D.I.B. XIII (so named because it is housed in the private libraries of Kings and Queens) in a strictly limited Edition. The Royal Edition will contain approximately 1,500 pages; it is sewn and bound by hand in full red Morocco leather and has gold-edged leaves. There are five raised bands on the spine, hand-worked silk head and tail bands, and seven gold panels. There are double gold lines around the inside leather margins and single gold lines around the outside covers. All the gold used is of 22 carat. If requested, the name of the owner can be embossed in gold on the front cover at no extra charge. The Royal Edition comes within a fleece-lined slip-case.
