

'62-'64 period during which Swanson developed interest in Don - Don dropped in over the period trying to figure out how to put his wife into the arch. jobs - even in Ohio they were only interested in Turkey tails (viewed arrowheads processing like stamping out coins)

Swanson wasn't interested though encouraging until Marie arranged Les Eyzies, Swanson finally arranged after Les Eyzies \$4500/yr on a pt. time basis - and then for 1st time Don even hired help to cut his grass etc.

In this interim - and always before - w/ end exploration for material - tho, Utah, San Valley (Utah specifically) - very frustrating - the heart caprice etc. carrying oxygen everywhere

Never thought he'd "get in"

Pd. their (Evelyn & Don) own way to conferences & slowly I.S.C. (Swanson) provided some travel after Les Eyzies - visiting however, Swanson digs (Buck Creek etc. - ^{where} Swanson lost his eyesight suddenly (diabetes) in the field by picking up two buckets at once and both eyes hemorrhage.

"Earle made Idaho Archeology"

Don never felt frustrated by not being "swept into the fraternity of Archeologists" but he did seem undervalued by it believing in the integrity of his knapping research.

At some early age
