
DAHO STATE UNIVERSITY

1974 SUMMER FLINTWORKING SCHOOL

Under a grant from the National Science Foundation, the Idaho State University Museum will offer a 4 week field school in flintknapping under the direction of Don Crabtree, Museum Research Associate in Primitive Technology . . . Four stipends of \$500 each will be granted to students selected from applicants to the field school. Each applicant must be a graduate student now or have been accepted for a graduate school beginning September 1974 . . . Students must submit a letter of interest, a vita and have two letters of recommendation sent by faculty who know the student well . . . Application deadline is April 1, 1974. Appointments will be made by April 15. If selected a student will be notified of further details about the flintworking school, but must be prepared to meet all costs from the \$500 stipend . . . The field school will start June 15 . . . The location will probably be near Twin Falls, Idaho. A tent camp will be set up with tents, cots, Coleman stoves and lamps supplied by the Idaho State University Museum. Each student must supply a sleeping bag and clothes suitable for life and work outdoors.
