Dear Ms. Blitzer:

This is to notify you of your appointment as a fellow on the flintworking session with Don Crabtree. Please notify me promptly of your acceptance or rejection of the offer because we have chosen two alternates to fill any vacancies.

The school will be held just outside of Twin Falls at Dierke's Lake which is in the Snake River Canyon about 4 mile above Shoshone Falls. The weather will be warm and windy with a possibility of showers. School begins June 16; please arrive on the 15th or 16th. No facilities will be available before the 15th. Days off are Sunday and Monday's. Monday, the 17th will be the day off to get organized and settled. We must know as soon as possible how and what time you are arriving at Twin Falls so arrangements can be made well ahead of time.

This is a field camp situation, with tents, cots, and general cooking and camp gear supplied. However, you must furnish bedroll and personal gear which will complement a field camp near a lake, with occasional trips to Twin Falls for food and entertainment. We require that each person come alone without family and that you live in the camp situation for the duration of the flintworking school. We encourage this because of 1. the professional dedication needed in such a field situation and 2. that many evenings the spirited and informative discussions enhance greatly the mutual knowledge and benefit of the school. We desire that this close-knit camp situation be maintained. You should have your own medical insurance because cuts are common and occasionally require a doctor's attention. The Idaho State University Museum does not provide insurance for participants.

If you have any small, but interesting, archaeological collections which you can bring without great inconvenience, that would be welcomed. Also, bring any lithic material - so much the better.

Your fellowship check will be waiting for you and it will be possible to cash the check at a bank in Twin Falls. You must allow for food with this \$500 award. The school will furnish local transportation when needed. However, any personal transportation will not only be permitted, but welcomed.
