I think the course was very good and I certainly learned a great deal. Having such an intensive introduction was good, especially with the lab being open at night.

- the length of the course is nice because it's hard to take off more than one week in the summer.
- the TV monitors were good although for certain things, like positioning pressure tools, one had to go and sit beside Don.
- the instructor was just super and it made the course worth while just to watch him work.
- at times the lighting in the lab was inadequate, and the TV lights, when they were available, really helped.

It's difficult to analyze exactly what I have learned—
except that much of the material I had learned on analyzing flakes
is either inadequate or completely rock. I have some better ideas
of what to look for now. I have also learned some basic techniques
in flintknapping which I hope I can build on. Before this course
I had tried flaking obsidian and even with a hammerstone I could
not consistently detach a flake.

The course is definitely a good idea and if there was an intermediate course offered I would take it. I would even take this course again if given the chance.
