

## 1976 SUMMER FLINTKNAPPING SCHOOL

WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY will offer a six week field school for eight (8) graduate hours credit in flintknapping under the direction of J. Jeffrey Flenniken (Laboratory of Lithic Technology, Washington State University) and Donald E. Crabtree. Based upon a letter of interest, vitae, and two letters of recommendation, twelve (12) students will be selected to attend this school. Each applicant must be a graduate student now or have been accepted for a a graduate school beginning September 1976. Application deadline is April 30, 1976. Appointments will be made by May 10, 1976. The field school will begin June 15. The location will probably be in the Bitterroot Mountains of Northern Idaho. Housing will be provided by Washington State University. Each student must supply a sleeping bag, cooking utensils, and additional camping equipment. Tentative cost is \$160.00 for eight (8) graduate hours credit from Washington State University and \$150.00 laboratory fee.
