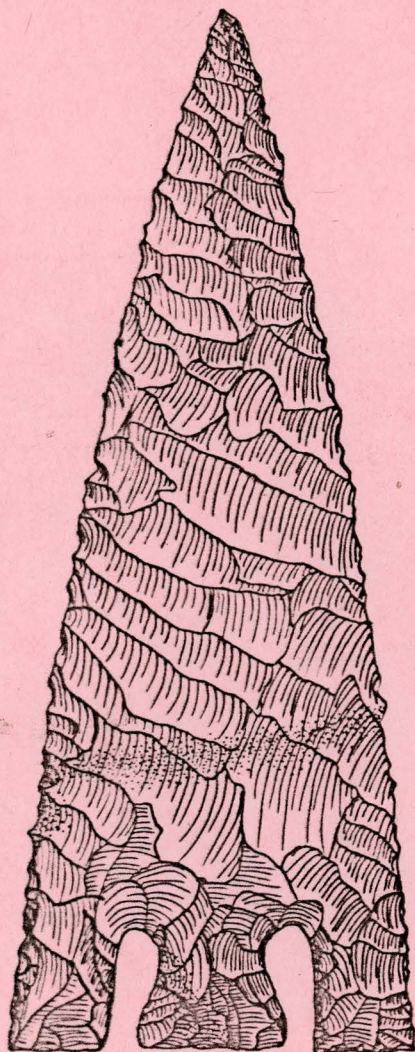

1980 SUMMER FLINTKNAPPING SCHOOL

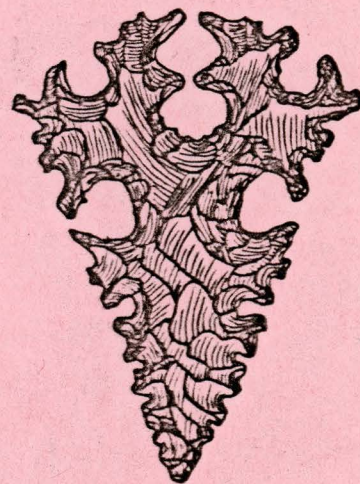


WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY will offer a four week field school for four (4) graduate hours credit or six (6) undergraduate hours credit in flintknapping under the direction of Dr. J. Jeffrey Flenniken (Lithics Laboratory, Washington State University) and Dr. Donald E. Crabtree (Research Associate, University of Idaho). Based on a letter of interest, vita, and two letters of recommendation, seven (7) students will be selected to attend this school. Each applicant must be a university undergraduate student or a graduate student accepted by a university beginning September 1980. Professionals are also encouraged to apply. Application deadline is May 2, 1980. The field school will begin June 17

and end July 18. The location will be the Palouse River Valley near Pullman, Washington. A tent camp including all necessary equipment will be provided by the Lithics Laboratory. Each student must supply a personal sleeping bag and clothes suitable for work out of doors. Cost is \$27 per credit hour from Washington State University and a \$300 special fee (including tool kit, raw materials, etc.).
