Dear Don;

Arrangements have been made for your demonstrations to be given in a room with a TV camera so that people can watch you and watch the detail of your hand actions on a TV screen at the same time. As the room is not very large and as considerable interest has been expressed by many people around the University, I have scheduled three separate 'performances': one Monday night at 7:30 for the Archaeological Society members primarily, one Tuesday afternoon, and another Wednesday afternoon primarily for the University staff and students. As if this wasn't enough for you to do, the opportunity presented itself for the University to make a color film of flaking procedures. I do not know if this film will be duplicated and sold, but we will have the film available for our future classes here. Mr. Jim Salt, the photographer, has had experience photographing artifacts. I will introduce you to him on Monday morning and you can carry on from there. He doesn't think that it will take too long to finish the job.

Dr. Richard Forbis, on the Calgary campus, will arrange for a meeting of the Calgary branch of the Archaeological Society for Friday night, Oct. 9. He may also wish to have a separate demonstration for his classes on Friday or possibly Saturday. Hence you will be able to travel to Calgary on Thursday.

I am still in the process of making arrangements for the University to cover expenses and for the Society to give an honorarium. The basis for the expense check is the cost of a round trip economy air fare from Twin Falls to Edmonton (\$120). I hope that between Calgary and Edmonton, we shall be able to better that a bit. In addition, I see no reason why we cannot arrange to pay you for the type specimens while you are here.

Ruth and I are looking forward to seeing you and Evelyn on Sunday, October 4. We live near the Calgary Trail near the south entrance to the city (just a few blocks west of the oil derrick on Hwy. 2 south). Just ask anyone where 10515 53 Ave. would be when you get in the neighborhood, or phone 439-4177. If you come in from Jasper, take 111th Ave. eastward off the bypass highway and turn south at Westmount Shopper's Park to cross the Great Bridge. Follow the Hwy 2 signs through the University area on to 113th St.; after getting onto the new four lane highway going east, turn south on 106th St. to 53 Ave. where you turn east to our place. I am enclosing a map which shows most of this route.

Have a wonderful trip. The mountains are beautiful in their fresh coat of white, and the weather recently has been splendid, although the leaves are starting to fall.
