Thank you for your letter of May 22nd regarding the making of arrowheads. Please pardon the delay in answering, as I have just returned from a lengthy stay at Ann Arbor and am behind in my correspondence.

I am currently writing the history of flintknapping, but, as yet, have not completed this work. However, several articles have been published by the Museum at Idaho State University where I am employed.

If you will subscribe to the Museum journal "Tebiwa" (\$1.50 per year) you will receive these articles as they are published. To date they cover "Thermal Treatment of stones", "Folsom point", "Suitable Lithic Materials" and "Tools of the Flintknapper" and shortly there should be a publication on the Polyhedral cores and blades of Mexico.
