Dr. Crabtree !



The paper on the obtuse angle as a functioning edge is very suggestive - and I shall certainly look for possible wearmarks on Danish lithic material. BEing aware of the possibility is often the major step towards recognizing.

Lately I got hold of the late Dr. Swanson's book: Lithic Technology ... - and I am now studying the papers with interest.

Your experiments in replicating Danish blades with small platforms are of high interest to me. (From where did you get the blades ?) I look forward to read about the results.

I am at present preparing a paper on the late paleolithic in Denmark. In this I hope to be able to show how knowledge of the flinttechnology and the availability and quality of flint gives rise to a better understanding of the lithic remains at the sites.
