I would like to thank  
you for your offer of a shipment of Obsidian  
flakes. However I do not care to have  
them shipped by motor transport and I can't  
stand the shock of twelve dollars for the cost  
of shipping. I am sorry I have become a  
nuisance to you, however you are the one  
person to me who can bring me a great  
pleasure. The sawdust I suggested in the  
use of packing can be substituted by a  
number of rolls of Kitchen paper toweling  
used in interlayering between layers of flakes.  
Please use the money enclosed in this letter  
for four or five rolls of toweling and make  
a package of about 15 or 20 pounds in a  
cardboard carton with layers of toweling

Between the chips just tight enough to keep them from becoming loose Please do that just this once more for me and I will be forever grateful to you You need not include large and thick flakes I would rather have the smaller thinner flakes suitable for bird points you can ship Parcel Post and I will send you the price when I receive the shipment

In the meantime use the money for the traveling I am enclosing and God bless you for your trouble and if you have a obsidian knife handy throw it into the box together with the publication on pressure flaking which some you promised No not send flint chips just obsidian and I am sure you know the suitable ones for a fellow who knows so little about flaking Now with wishes of good luck for your months of field school work and best of health I beg to remain forever thankful
