ses--especially w/regard to North and Meso-Ameri-
can obsidian materials. Our studies presently
range from typological and distributional analy-
sis, to work connected with natural glass chemis-
try and hydration chronometry. Any reference

World will be happily added to our growing lib-

the U.S. as possible, and will share our hydra-
