I have had a personal interest in this Adz quarry through Dr. Richard Gould and a visit to Hawaii to examine the material. He has kept me advised of the developments of this site and the techniques of the artifacts. This investigation has shown the importance of the application of technology to result in a more complete understanding of the early settlement of the Hawaiian Islands. The basalt found in this quarry is a rare commodity for this area because of the extrusive volcanics which are almost all made up of vesicular lavas and scoria.
