Please pardon me for delaying this long-intended letter and package of assorted lithic material. I cannot tell you how much Evelyn and I enjoyed the meeting this last May. It was a very rewarding session and you were a great host. I am only sorry our visit was so short.

Under separate cover, I am sending you a package of lithic material which you can share with Bill Roosa, George Frieson and Gary Wright. Since you are all in the same department, I want you to do as you like with the material. Since George and Bill are interested in flakes and debris, I enclosed an accumulation of pressure flakes of assorted material, including some of red glass. For testing, there is a packet of my blades made of obsidian from Glass Butte and Bend, Oregon; obsidian material from Iceland, New Zealand and Obsidian Cliff, Yellowstone Park; as well as two unfinished projectile points and their last series of flakes. There is some flint from Dover, England, Grand Pressigny, France and flint from two sources in Indiana.

Sorry for the long delay, but have had a succession of house guests this Summer. Enjoyed them all and particularly Francois Bordes. We had fifteen days of uninterrupted experimenting which was most rewarding. Sure hated to see him leave.
