You have, indeed, instigated a new approach regarding the interaction of the lithic industries of extinct societies. With your approach a numerical analysis is necessary in order to evaluate the motor habits and flaking patterns. What I feel is not necessary are the long laundry lists of flake attributes when only a few really apply to a given flake assemblage. Joel, I want to encourage you to continue what I consider an important contribution in this field. It promises many new and exciting discoveries in archaeology. I am looking forward to your results and conclusions when you apply this technique and method of analysis to some of the more sophisticated implements of paleo-man. You have written an excellent paper and I hope it will be published in one of the widely distributed journals. I found only one error - the obsidian came from Glass Butte.
