You will probably remember Joseph Palacios, the Belize Archaeological Commissioner whom we met at Altun Ha, and who later came up to Orange Walk to attend the opening part of the conference. He tells me he is tired of "stones and bones", and is pursuing graduate work in his original field, social anthropology.

Again, I hope that you and Evelyn are doing better. Please give her my greetings and very best wishes.
