Dear Don:

A good number of the flakes and side scrapers made of Brown chalcedony, "Knife River Flint" at the Walter Felt site in Saskatchewan, that I excavated in 1962 & 65, have striations or "ribbing" at oblique angles along one or two edges and small nicks on the opposite side. I wonder if this is what Semenov (1964 p. 109) refers to as "ribbing" produced by parings from "whittling knives" or is it fissures from flake manufacture that occur on the positive side of the bulb of percussion (see Oakley 1955 "Man the Toolmaker" p. 11, Fig 46)?

I enclose one of these flakes for your opinion. You need not return it.

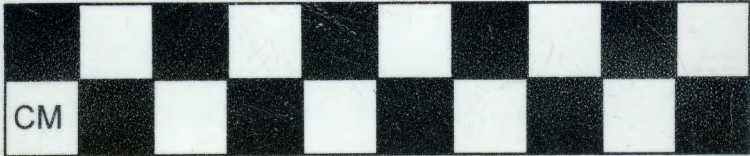
